Bus Route Changes

Vegas Las System, Inc., has applied to the Public Service Commission for authority to effect certain bus route changes and also to make certain changes in bus fares.

The bus company states that the basic rates would be increased from 25¢ to 35¢ for adult fare-paying passengers. These new rates would apply to all zones. There will be no additional charges for zones as zoning as amended by the tariffs. At present a charge of 5¢ is applied to each zone charge.

There will be no charge for transfers. At present a 5¢ charge is made for each transfer.

Free fare is proposed for children under 6 years of age accompanied by an adult fare-paying passenger. This raises the age limit from 5 to 6 years. The fare for children under 13 years of age age is reduced from the former adult fare to 15¢. Fares for children between 13 and 18 years of age on school days is reduced from

The school commuter fare is increased from \$3.75 for 30 tickets to \$5.50 for a 40 ride ticket, or an increase from 12-1/2¢ to 13or an increase of 1-1/4¢. The fare for tokens would be increased from \$2.00 for 10 tokens to \$2,95 for 10 tokens.

Route changes are proposed for buses on Routel, Hyde Park; Route 3, North Las Vegas via Salt Lake Highway; Route 4 Kelso-Turner; Route 5, Huntridge; Route 6, Las Vegas Boulevard South (Strip); Route 7, North Las Vegas (College Park); Route 8, Golf Ridge; Route 9, Vegas Heights; Route 10, University. Bus passengers are invited to check with the Company on the various changes in schedules and routes.

The company states that a recent study indicates that the proposed routes and schedules are for the best interests of the public served, and that the proposed new routes and schedules will be the most convenient and to the best interests of passengers of Las Vegas Transit System, Inc.

The bus company advises that in order to operate the new proposed routes and schedules it will necessitate the addition of 4 transit buses and approximately 55 driver pay hours per day on weekdays and approximately 16 driver pay hours per day on Sundays and holidays.
