MONTREAL (WNS) President Zalman Shazar of Israel curtailed his visit to this country and returned to Israel, wherehis country is facing a military and political crisis resulting from Arab threats of war.

ST. NEW YORK (WNS) Y.S. Agnon, 79-year-old Israeli winner of the 1966 Nobel Prize for Literature, told a distinguished gathering here of more than 1,500 that "just as America is the biggest of all lands so is the American Jewish community the biggest of all Jewish communities."

BUENOS AIRES (WNS) The Jewish cemetery at Santa Rosa in the province of Pampa has been desecrated by unknown vandals who smashed twenty tombstones and erased incriptions from many others. This was the first such incident in the history of Santa Rosa.

SAND FRANCISCO (WNS) An attempt by some 100 Arabs to disrupt an Israel Independence Day celebration here triggered a melee which was broken up by the police without arrests.

BREENFIELD PARK, N.Y. said he was confident the Israeli army possessed the capacity to repulse any act of aggression, adding that Israel planned to rely not only on its army but on diplomacy as well. At the same time he asserted that Egypt's blocking of the Strait of Tiran constituted an act of aggression, giving Israel the 'right to defend itself, should conditions warrant" such a move.

Even while the Premier was addressing the nation, President Nasser of the United Arab Republic threatened Israel with extermination, declaring he will not stop until Israel is regained for the Arabs.

Meanwhile it has been reported that five Egyptian soldiers, including three officers, had been captured in the Sinai border when their jeep crossed into Israelterritory, and a U.S. ship was fired upon.

The government's policy is to be clarified in Knesset in a speech by Mr. Eshkol. The Cabinet is believed to have approved a policy that would "obviate the necessity of Israel having touse her forces for her defense" except in the event the tension eludes resolution by diplomacy.

From Washington meanwhile it has been reported that the State Department has been in close touch with Soviet officials on the situation, Also, it is understood that the Soviet Charges d' Affaire in Washington presented to Secretary of State Dean Rusk a special message from Moscow on the current crisis in the Middle

In Israel meanwhile, a high official of the United Jewish Appeal, Rabbi Herbert Friedman, was reported to have worked out a plan with Israeli leaders with the view to launching a special emergency campaign to raise funds for Israel in its present hour of grave need. The plan envisages the coming to the United States of a number of Jewish Agency leaders with the view to stimulating the special campaign in major Jewish areas of concentration in the United States.

And in Jerusalem forty members of the American Jewish Press Association, whose 25th annual convention opened there despite the crisis, said they were highly pleased with the attention the parley received in the light of the crisis in the country. The Premier could not address the opening session. Instead the delegates were greeted by A.L. Pincus, chairman of the Jewish Agency, by the Israeli Union of Journalists and the World Bureau of Jewish Journalists.



JERUSALEM (WNS) The annual convention of the Ameri can Jewish Press Association opened here last Friday despite the tense situation existing in the country and the advice by American officials that U.S. citizens leave the country.

On announcing that the convention would be held as scheduled, Association president Adolph Rosenberg, editor and publisher of the Southern Israelite, said that "the Association's convention in Israel at this time in history is of the greatest importance in the development of the ongoing history of the nation," and that, in addition, it served 'as a demonstration of the solidarity of American Jewry with the State of Israel."
