among the innocent victims of the current crisis in the Middle East are thousands of Jews living in the Arab countries, whose plight has ranged from harrassment to death.

Mr. Abram's comment accompanied the issuance by the COMMITTEE of a country - by - country summary of the situation among approximately 100,000 Jews in the United Arab Republic, Libya, Morocco, Tunisia, Syria, Algeria, Lebanon, A-den, and Iraq.

He said that Jews in these countries had been subjected to various forms of harassment, including arrest and discrimination, and restriction of their internal freedom of movement and of their right to leave the country, and that there had been incidents of persecution, violence, arson, and looting.

"The indigenous populations of these countries, members of ancient Jewish communities, are the innocent victims of the passions aroused by the recent Middle East war, in which they have taken no part. As Arab representatives have themselves attested on many occasions in United Nations forums, these nationals and long - established residents of the Jewish faith have no connection with Zionism or the State of Israel.
