

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- The World Conference of Jewish Organizations has shifted the site of its annual meeting from Geneva to Jerusalem.

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (WNS) A policy statement urging overhauling of American policy in the Middle East to deal with "the underlying causes of conflict rather than recurring surface symptoms" was adopted here at the concluding session of the four-day national plenary session of the National Community Relations Advisory Council.

NEW ROCHELLE, N.Y. (WNS) Rabbi Henry E. Kagan of Mount Vernon, a consulting psychologist licensed to practice psychotherapy, has joined the faculty of Iona College, a Catholic institution. He will lecture on pastoral counseling.

ROME (WNS) Jacob Herzog, director general of Premier Levi Eshkol's office in Israel, presented a message to the Pope. Neither Vatican nor Israeli sources would disclose the nature of the message, but it is believed to have dealt with Israel's position on Jerusalem.

PARIS (WNS) Mrs. Golda Meir, former Israeli Foreign Minister and now secretary general of the Mapai party in Israel, voiced concern here over the reported resumption of shipping of huge war material shipment by the Soviet Union to Egypt, particularly planes and tanks. Mrs. Meir was in France to attend a parley of the French Socialist Party.

NEW YORK (WNS) Reunification of Jerusalem was welcomed by the New York Board of Rabbis in a statement which said that continued division of the Holy City would perpetuate the split.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Arabs in the west bank section will be permitted to leave Israel only on written requests having the approval of local municipal or regional officials. This decision was made at a Cabinet meeting to dispel rumors that Israel expelled or encouraged the emigration of Arabs from the west bank.

FALLSBURGH, N.Y. (WNS) Cessation of interfaith dialogues until Christian leadership supports the territorial and political integrity of Israel was counseled here by Rabbi Pesach Z. Levowitz, president of the Rabbinical Council of America.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (WNS) Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban, at a press conference here, charged that the Soviet Union was making "intensive shipments" of arms to Egypt and Syria.

NEW YORK (WNS) Officials of the Congress of Racial Equality in Brooklyn have been accused of "blatant and vicious anti-Semitic outbursts and racist behaviour" by the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, which asked the New York City Commission on Human Rights to investigate the charges.

BERLIN (WNS) Hans Gunther, Prosecutor General of West Germany, announced the arrest of five former Nazi officials who, he said, would be put on trial on charges of complicity in the mass murder of Jews and Poles in occupied Poland during the war. Among the arrested men Bernhard Baatz and Dr. Joachim Deumling, who headed the Polish Department in the Security Service.

and barriers, tens of thousands of Jerusalemites congregated at the Mandelbaum Gate in anticipation of being among the first to visit the site.

At the same time it was announced by municipal officials that former Old City employees would be retained on their jobs and that they could, if they wished, later apply for permanent status on the city's payroll. It was also announced that the new municipal council was to include Old City inhabitants.

Meanwhile there was concern here over a report that the United States will not recognize the validity of the reunification of the city. And, in Washington, President Johnson was reported to have said that he was against Israel's annexing of the Old City of Jerusalem until there had been full consultation with Christian and Moslem religious leaders on the issue. Special attention was focused here on a statement by the American State Department that "the hasty administrative action" taken by Israel "cannot be regarded as determining the future of the holy places or the future of the holy places or the status of Jerusalem in relation to them."

In the meantime, the eyes of the country are on the United Nations in New York, where the special session of the General Assembly has been debating the Mid-East crisis without any indications of agreement on any of the resolutions before it. But there is no inclination here to predict the outcome either in the General Assembly or later in the Security Council, to which the final resolution is to be submitted. The outcome, in the opinion of many informed circles here, may well rest on the number of United Nations member-countries who will abstain from voting than on the number who will cast their votes. If there are heavy abstentions, the solid vote by the combined Arab-Soviet bloc in the General Assembly could be decisive. In the Security Council a vote can be nullified by a veto, and the question many here ask is: Will the United States choose to exercise its first veto in the Security Council to thwart adoption either of the Soviet resolution or any other proposal that would brand Israel as the aggressor and direct her to relinquish the occupied territory?

Meanwhile life in the country is taking on a degree of normalcy with the lifting of restrictions and the easing of the tensions of war.
