Israel and Egypt consented to a proposal by Secretary

Holy Sites For All

TEL AVIV (WNS) Premier Levi Eshkol has clarified Israel's position on a pressing problem in an interview with the Hebrew daily Yedioth Achronoth, in which he is quoted as having said that Israel was prepared to share responsibility for holy sites with all faiths if they ask it.

At the same time the Premier asserted that Israel was not seeking ownership of places sacred to other religions. In reply to a question what measures were contemplated for the supervision of the holy places, Mr. Eshkol replied that no decision has been reached and that none would be made until it is nown what proposals have been brought by the Pope's representative, who now is in Israel, "I shall try to persuade him," the Premier is quoted as having said," that we can be trusted with controlling holy places just as well as others did, if not better."

Apropos the Soveit Union and France, Mr. Eshkol said that Moscow's stand was hostile and France's regrettable. He also remarked that if the Soviet Union keeps up its current pace of arming Egypt, Syria and Algeria, the French embargo could have serious consequences, forcing Israel to look elsewhere to ensure her security.

The special session was convened on complaints by both Egypt and Israel accusing each other of breaking the cease - fire arrangement, The ensuing clashes involved land and air skirmishes, with casualties on both sides.

Soviet chief delegate Nikolai T. Federenko's violent outbursts against Israel broght rejoinders from Lord Caradon of Britain, Ambassador Goldberg of the United States and Ambassador Rafael of Israel, Lord Carodon said that instead of "violent and intemperate language," he preferred the statement by Leonid L Brezhnew, General Secretary of the Soviet Communist Party, who said "we must all do everything so that the flames of war do not break out again," Ambassador Goldberg called the Fedorenko speech "provocative and baseless," declaring that the Soviet representative was making baseless charges in order 'to divert the Council from the business at hand," Ambassador Rafael said he had "reason to believe that Mr. Fedorenko, the great torch bearer of truth, would have been more austere in his invectives," adding that "the only truth for Mr. Federenko was that of Moscow and Cairo." He accused the Soviet representative of bearing "unmitigated hatred for my country and people." Federenko and his deputy walked out when Ambassador Rafael rose in reply.

The plan has been approved by the plenary session of the Jewish Agency executive, which also approved a proposal to send some 500 young Israelis to the western countries with the view of explaining spects in Israel and encouraging immigration.
