(The following statement was issued by the Israel Prime Minister Levi Eshkol on September 3, 1967)

With the end of hostilities and the coming into force of the cease fire, the Government of Israel made known its desire to conclude peace treaties with the Arab States and announced its readiness to embark forthwith upon negotiations with its neighbours. This announcement of the Government of Israel elicited no positive response from the Arab rulers who, having now met at their conference in Khartoum, have resolved and made known their intention not to conclude a peace with Israel, not to recognize the fact of Israel's existence, and not to enter into negotiations with her.

This irresponsible decision ignores the true interest of the peoples of the re-

gion and is in conflict with the principles of the United Nations. The Government of Israel registers with regret this grave fact which puts back the prospects of peace in our region, and takes note of its political and military implications. The posture of the heads of the Arab States strengthens Israel's resolve not to permit a restoration of conditions which would enable those who seek Israel's harm to undermine her security.

Israel will persist in her readiness to enter into peace accords with her neighbours, will strictly abide by the arrangements laid down in the cease-fire agreements, and will stand staunchly in the positions vital to the undisturbed security and development of the State in face of the aggressive designs of the Arab leaders who refuse to negotiate a peace.

NASSER TO PROVOKE WAR

JERUSALEM (WNS) Secret documents in the hands of Israel on the recent Arab summit conference in Khartoum show that among the decisions taken by the parley was one under which President Nasser of Egypt was to launch a series of shooting incidents in the Suez Canal region with the view to forcing a special session of the U.N. Security Council ere the General Assembly opens its session on Sept. 19.

The thinking behind this plan rests in Arab belief that the time is more propitious now for passage of a resolution by the Security Council on the return of the captured territory.

In the meantime it has been learned that Israel reacted coldly to a proposal by friendly Western powers that the United Nations, through a special representative, probe the possibility of effecting peace talks between Israel and the Arab states. The suggestion was said to have been made individually to the Israeli Foreign Ministry by representatives of those powers. The Israeli reply was believed to have indicated that neither mediation nor arbitration was the way to peace, only direct talks.

In East Jerusalem, once called the Old City, the process of integration took another advance step when Hebrew name-plates went upon the city's street signs. In a related development, the

Ministry of Finance announced issuance of an order vesting ownership of the Old City's Jewish quarter in the State of Israel. The acquired area is to be transformed as a national site of religious and historic interest.

STARTING IN ALREADY

JERUSALEM (WNS) Speculation that a clash in which two Arab terrorists were killed, would be continuation of raids in Israel by the Syrian-based El Fatah group was ripe here as government officials announced that if the pre-war raid pattern is resumed appropriate measures may become necessary to deal with the situation.

The clash, which occurred within Israel territory, was fatal to an Israeli security patrol. Two of the terrorists were seized and placed under arrest.

It is generally believed here that renewal of the guerilla operations was inspired and directed by Syria despite the alleged decision of the recent Arab summit meeting in Khartoum not to resort to the use of arms as a means of solving Arab-Israel differences.

At the same time it was reported that Jordanian soldiers violated the cease-fire by shooting at an Israel patrol across the Allenby Bridge. The Israelis answered the fire. There were no casualties in the twenty minute clash.
