If we were hurt by insincerity, hypocrisy, and false rumor in the "old world", it is not unlikely that we ourselves were not above reproach in such conduct,

If we were disillusioned by what we believed to be true and loyal friendship in the "old world", it is quite possible that we experienced what others were caused to experience through our own disloyalty at one time or another.

If in the "old world" we sought love and were offered hate instead, it may be that we were seeking to harvest what we did not plant,

If in the "old world" we dreamed noble dreams and failed to realize them, it could be due to the price we refused to pay for what we envisioned and desired,

If we looked for truth and found falsehood in the "old world", it is not inconceivable that the falsehood we met, was one of our own children,

If in the "old world", we went out to look for beauty and were terribly disappointed when we found ugliness in its place, then we should ask how much beauty we gave to the world, that we expected to find any of it there.

If in the "old world", we were troubled by notices of the "vanishing Jew", it behooves us to ask of ourselves what we did to preserve Judaism, to honor it, to instill it in our children, to practice it,
