RED "REIGN OF TERROR"

JERUSALEM (WNS)—An appeal "to the conscience of all mankind" to help alleviate the plight of the Jews in the Arab countries which unleashed a "reign of black terror" against them following the outbreak of the Arab-Israel war, was issued here by the Chief Rabbinate of Israel and distributed to thou-

sands of churchmen, public figures and humanitarian agencies in the country.

Detailing the "daily torture, beatings and humiliations" to which the Jews in several Arab countries have been subjected, often at the hands of former Nazis, the Chief Rabbinate said it di-

Lets Not Forget These Lice

DORMSTADT (WNS) The trial of eleven men charged with the mass killing of tens of thousands of Jews and others at Baby Yar, a ravine on the outskirts of the Soviet city of Kiev, opened amidst indications that the accused will interpose a plea of innocence on the ground that they participated in the slaughter in obedience to orders from their superiors.

The principal defendant, former SS officer K. Kalman, is charged in the indictment with personal involvement in the slaying of more than 8,000 Jews. Post war documents and testimony by eye-witnesses showed that the Nazis rounded up the Jews in Kiev and led them to slaughter in the ravine. The Babi Yar slaughter was one of the most barbarous in the history of Nazi

barbarism. Countless hundreds of the victims, men, women and children, were thrown into the ravine while still alive.

TEL AVIV (WNS) If war breaks out again, Israel will carry the fight to the enemy's soil, Israel's chief of Staff Yitzhak Rabin warned in an interview in the Hebrew daily Yediot Achronot.

At the same time the Israeli Chief of Staff was quoted as having said that Israel would hold on to its occupied positions until a settlement is reached with the Arab countries. He simultaneously asserted that eighty percent of the arms losses suffered by Egypt and Syria in the Six Day War have been replaced by the Soviet Union.

"One Man Plus The Truth
Constitutes A Majority"

It is really a "shonder" (shame) we have to spend time, effort and space on a repulsive subject at this particular date when our mind and heart should be filled with love, meditation, repentance and hope for a Happy New Year. But we cannot let it linger for even another week.

We refer, of course, to the disgrace to American journalism displayed last Sunday in the West magazine of the Los Angeles Times, hereinafter referred to as the Worst magazine of the Lost Angeles Times.

A couple of contemporaries have already vented their resentment, but neither carried their pitch far enough. We have to open up with the big guns, or we could not face ourself in the mirror tomorrow morning. Here's why.

About seven years ago, we sacrificed complacency, contentment, long standing friendships, proximity to relatives and secure business associations to trek our family 3,000 miles for the purchase of a newspaper in this state. The main purpose was to establish a publication that would be the Voice of Nevada, expressly to protest and answer desecrating references to our state, the last outpost in the world where mind, action and deed are free and living is easy.

In those days press agents pleaded, begged, implored feature writers to come here from all over the country. They came, were set up in luxurious suites, wined, dined, given money to gamble, even female companionship, chauffeured limousines, etc., etc., all on the cuff, of course. Then, to a man, returned to their dailies, syndicated columns and magazine headquarters -- and knocked our brains out. Nary a peep came from the owners of the hotels and there wasn't a writer in the state with guts to respond, except in the mildest words.

Before we invested every cent in the Tell coffers in the newspaper, we spoke with Moe Dalitz, Carl Cohen, the late Ben Goffstein, and others, who gave us their tongue-in-cheek blessings, hoping we could deliver a portion of our good intentions. It didn't take long.

In due time we blasted acid-writing, unappreciative bums, who had accepted our hospitality, then sank poisoned teeth into the hands that fed them. We had no fear or favor for the biggest of them, from the New York Times, to Life, The Saturday Evening Post, and a host of important dailies. But we didn't speak out on generalities. We hit them on specifics, calling a spade a spade, and a crumby report-
