# ISRAEL BONDS SUN

### ACT OF WAR

JERUSALEM (WNS) The first impact of the news that the sea tragedy which brought death to an estimated 51 crewmen aboard the three destroyers that were sunk by Egyptian naval missiles was one of shock and consternation. Now that the first shock has passed, the mood of the nation is one of determination and reliance on its political and military leadership to do what is deemed necessary to prevent a recurrence of similar incidents.

The government's reaction to the sinking of the Israeli ships, all of which were well outside the territorial waters of Egypt, was one of grave concern and warning that this was the gravest violation of the cease fire pact.

Addressing the Cabinet, Premier Levi Eshkol warned that Egypt's action was "intolerable," that it had

dangerous implications and that Israeli citizens and servicemen will not be left unprotected. Mr. Eshkol said the attack was unprovoked and a grave violation not alone of the cease-fire but of international navigation laws. According to reports the boats were sunk by Soviet made missiles used by Egyptian naval units, probably under guidance by Soviet experts.

While warning of the dangerous implications of the incident, the Premier called for peace talks.

The Cabinet meeting was attended by highest army and naval authorities, Military experts here who are familiar with Egypt's capacity are convinced that the missiles used against the Israeli ships were manned or certainly under the direct control of Soviet "technicians," a euphemism for

### EGYPT PREDICTED WAR
