

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK, N.Y., A major Soviet newspaper chose the eve of Rosh Hashana to publish a 3,000-word denunciation of the American Jewish community as part of "an international Zionist conspiracy."

WASHINGTON, D.C. . . . Simchat Torah, a holiday of special significance to Russian Jews, has inspired a series of events in different cities during the past week. On the eve of Simchat Torah, 21 Senators took the floor to urge the Soviet Union to end discriminatory practices against Russian Jewry.

Berlin (WNS) Representatives of the Jewish community here were told by Mayor Klaus Schutz of West Berlin that right-wing radicalism remained a problem in Germany and required careful observation, "but I would n't agree with those who fear that the criminals of yesterday could ever get a chance in Germany." The Mayor spoke at a ceremony in the community center marking the 29th anniversary of the burning of Jewish synagogues on the "Crystal Night."

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Gen. Moshe Dayan, Israel's Defense Minister, has expressed Israel's "profound regret and disappointment" over the refusal of the United Nations to investigate and to fix the exact spot off the Sinai Coast where the Israel destroyer Elath was sunk on Oct. 21 by Soviet-made missiles launched from Egyptian attack boats.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Dr. Ludwig Erhard, former chancellor of West Germany, told newsmen that he did not believe anti-Semitism in "democratic Germany" had any chance of becoming contagious or a force.

ROME (WNS) -- Italy's small Jewish community, which today numbers only 33,000, is in danger of demographic extinction as a result of declining birth rate, migration and the effects of Nazi and Fascist persecution 25 years ago.

N.Y.C -- The fifty-third annual meeting of the Joint Distribution Committee, major American agency aiding needy Jews overseas, will be held December 6, 1967, at the New York Hilton Hotel, New York City, it was announced this week by Louis Broide, JDC Chairman.

BLABBING KING CLAMS UP

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The effort of King Hussein of Jordan to create an image of Arab "moderation" during his current tour of Western capitals have been booby-trapped by the "hard" and intransigent position of his colleague and ally, Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser, who called for an "urgent" session of the United Nations Security Council to discuss the Arab-Israeli crisis.

Hussein's television offer of Arab concessions to Israel was not repeated in subsequent conversations the king had with Secretary of State Dean Rusk and later with President Johnson. While the king's statements to the President remain secret, official sources have disclosed that the king's stand had hardened during the course of his visit; and Cairo's call for the "urgent" session of the Security Council was seen as a signal to Hussein to abandon his posture of moderation.

In the proedural wrangling

at the Security Council's "urgent" session which had been called by Egypt, it was evident that the strategy of the Soviet Union and its Arab clients was to prevent Israel's Foreign Minister Abba Eban from taking the floor immediately after the scheduled opening speech by Egypt's permanent representative, Mohammed El Koyn.

King Hussin's "moderate" views were further offset by recurring raids from his kingdom such as the one near Hebron, in the West Bank area, when seven Arab intruders were killed.

A possible American-Jordanian agreement, the official sources declared, could have created an image of the Americans as "angels of peace" -- in the face of the prevailing image of warmongers because of the South Viet Nam. They said that the Soviet Union had therefore acted through Egypt, in demanding the "urgent" session, to forestall such an agreement.
