This is THANKSGIVING DAY IN VIETNAM 1967. I am in Dak To in the Jungled Central Highlands of South Vietnam. The campaign here has been very fierce and rugged over the last seventeen days. The reports show the Communist death toll is well over one thousand and American casualties have been high. Under heavy fire and assault the paratroopers of U. S. 173rd Brigade Airborne have added to their glory in making a firm stand. This is only one spot in the Vietnam war. These are our American Men, fighting and dying for the ideals all Americans live by. THESE are our boys that

only a few months ago were munching popcorn with their best girls at the Drive Inn Theatre or playing the guitar in a rock and roll band. Today he is a rugged Jungle soldier bent on destroying the enemy in anyway that he can; believing in what our country stands for no matter what some people may think.
