JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JOHANNESBURG (WNS) The necessity of continued maintenance of inter-community understanding and good will between Jews and non-Jews, especially in light of differences that have developed recently between South Africa and Israel over the latter's support and anti-apartheid policies in the United Nations, was stressed at the 25th biennial Congress of the South African Jewish Board of De uties.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (WNS)--Gunnar Jarring, a veteran Swedish diplomat, was believed to be United Nations Secretary U Thant's choice as the emissary to be sent to the Middle East under a Security Council resolution adopted unanimously.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Informed sources here said that Israel was expected to agree to the anticipated selection of Swedish diplomat Gunnar Jarring as the United Nations special representative to the Middle East to seek to arrange an Arab-Israeli agreement under the terms of the British resolution.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The Israel authorities have announced that Moslems from other countries wishing to make the pilgrimage to the Dome of the Rock a sacred Moslem shrine, in the Old City of Jerusalem, during the holy month of Ramadam can apply for Israeli visas.

NEW YORK (WNS)--The establishment of an American Jewish religious archive at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, which will be a source for historians delving into the background of Judaism's development in the new world, has been announced by Dr. Louis Finkelstein, chancellor of the Seminary.

NEW YORK: Samuel L. Haber, newly-designated Executive Vice-Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee, will deliver a report on the recent influx of North African Jews into France and Italy at the 53rd Annual Meeting of the JDC, December 6, at the New York Hilton Hotel.

NEW YORK: More than 1,000 Americans and Canadians settled in Israel during the four months, from July through October of this year, according to an announcement by Rabbi Mordecai Kirshblum, Chairman of the Israel Aliyah Center, 515 Park Avenue, New York City.

JACKSON, Miss. (WNS)--The bomb which virtually destroyed the home of Rabbi Perry E. Nussbaum almost took his life as well, the rabbi has reported to the police of this city. A few seconds before a bomb planted on his front lawn exploded, destroying the front of his house, the rabbi had moved from his seat near the window to the back of his living-room to turn off the light.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Nov. 19, 1967--American Jewish organizations should send young people to Israel "by the thousands" and not merely by the hundreds as at present, to establish durable links between the American and Israoz Jewish communities, Dr. Max F. Baer, national director of the 50,000 member B'nai B'rith Youth Organization, told the B'nai B'rith Youth Commission at its annual meeting.

BONN (WNS)--The "Unsung heroes" of the Nazi era in Germany--Germans who rescued Jews--were honored by West German Christians and Jews at a gathering in Beethoven Hall, Israel's Ambassador Asher Ban Nathan, United States Ambassador George McGee, West German Minister Carlo Schmidt and Kurt R. Grossman, an American active in the reparations program, were among those present,

NEW YORK (WNS)--A drive to raise \$6 million in the United States and Canada to aid the health, education and welfare services of Histadrut, Israel's Labor Federation, was launched by the National Committee for Labor Israel at the opening of its 44th annual convention.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The Cabinet approved the issuance of a postage stamp bearing the picture of the late Moshe Sharett who was Israel's first Foreign Minister, later Prime Minister and Chairman of the World Zionist Executive.

NEW YORK:--Yehuda Rosenman, sociologist, academician, and international expert on Jewish communal organization, has been named director of the American Jewish Committee's Department of Jewish Communal Affairs, it was announced today by Bertram H. Gold, Executive Director.

CARACAS, Venezuela (WNS) A New York rabbi who was raised in Peru, where his father served as chief rabbi, has been named Chief Rabbi of the Ashkenazi Jewish community of Caracas. The designee is Rabbi Pynchas Brener.
