Dear Jack Tell:
I read with deep interest the article by Rabbi Emanuel Forman entitled "Mountains of Difference - Sinai and Moriah" in your issue of Oct. 6, 1967.

I was especially impressed by Rabbi Forman's reference to Rabbi J. B. Soloveitchik's statement that "for the Jew nothing, with the exception of the Sabbath (probably because the Bible expressly states that God sanctified the Sabbath), ever becomes Holy, unless man makes it so." And Rabbi Forman refers to specific examples of Jewish ----- that receive their sanctity "through some religious gesture on the part of man."
The statement was especially reminiscent to me of the teaching I expounded in Bakersfield and San Diego, Cal., and perhaps elsewhere, that "the Sefer Torah is Holy, because Jews made it Holy, through their willingness down through history to sacrifice on its behalf - be it the sacrifice involved in the fulfillment of its teachings, or the sacrifice involved in the physical preservation of the Sefer

Torah in times of pogroms, etc.

I can easily imagine my statements having given umbrage to certain upholders of Jewish law and tradition, on the grounds that it renders "Holiness" subjective rather than objective.
