Mountain Youth Camp's Recreation Fund has netted \$3,465.

Spearheaded by well-known local bookmaker Sammy Cohen, the drive has, according to some, accomplished wonders at the county's youth facility.

As the county only supplies the 60-odd boys at the camp with essentials like food and clothing, virtually anything else they want or need must be supplied by donations

('ohen realized this more than six years ago when he organized the fund with the aid of (then) District Judge David Zenoff who acted as the fund's administrator.

In recent years the fund provided camp residents with books, football 'uni forms, a motion picture projector, a completely equipped boxing ring, and a heated swimming pool.

When funds for the pool ran short last year. Cohen matched them from his own pocket to see the camp's youngsters would be able to have their pool as promised.

After several years of vigorous campaigning, Cohen has gathered a large number of regular contributors who not only donate their time and money to the fund, but often solicit aid from other locals

campaign to raise money to build a gymnasium. Cohen is now gathering cost estimates on the materials needed.

"Labor is no problem," he says. ' With 60 heys and counselors up there, all we need are the materials. They'll do the rest "

The recreation fund is set up as a controlled account in a well-known Las Vegas bank. Cohen and camp director Don Wilson are the co-administrators, and both must sign checks insuring that all moneys are properly handled.

Cohen reports the fund has "paid off handsomely in terms of boosted morale at the camp. It's a clear demonstration that the people of Las Vegas really care."

Not all the money is used for recreation purposes. Cohen says. "Often there is a need which cannot be filled by the county. For instance, there is one boy at the camp who needed glasses, while another had lost some teeth. Both need ed financial help and we were able to supply it through the fund."

The list of contributors is lengthy, and there are many who have donated but asked to remain out of the limelight. However, Cohen feels State Senator Helcn Herr deserves special recognition for her efforts in getting contributions

The event, referred by former heavy weight champ "Sonny" Liston, netted the fund \$550.


The noted comedy team, Davis and Reese entertained sports fans, at the charity affair as their contribution to the campaign,
