U.S. Jews Assure Israel Total Support

NEW YORK (WNS) -- On the eve of the departure of Prime Minister Levi Eshkol of Israel, more than 2,500 leaders, representing almost all shades of organized Jewish life in the United States, presented to the people of Israel, through its Premier, their assurance of moral support for economic progress in the coming year.

American Jewry's pledge of unlimited aid was voiced by Edward Ginsberg of Cleveland, General Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, and by Samuel Rothberg of Peoria, Ill., National Campaign Chairman of the Israel Bond Organization, who served as co-chairman of a farewell dinner in honor of Prime Minister and Mrs. Eshkol.

The dinner, sponsored by 55 major national Jewish organizations, attracted an unusually large audience.

We will do it as you have done it, by never losing sight of the final goal -- the goal of a people reborn, in their own land, working and doing, making their full contribution to human advancement and the welfare of men everywhere, and living at last in security and peace."

Mr. Rothber, who introduced Mr. Eshkol, described him as "a world statesman who has borne the mantle of leadership in Israel in its most critical hours of decision, a courageous champion of Israel's freedom, a dynamic architect of its defense and economy, an inspiring symbol of its future whose achievements have written an unforgettable chapter in the epic of Israel" (Continued on Page 2)

Dear Jack and Mrs. Tell:

Trust you are all well and the New Year is good to you and yours. I am only sorry I couldn't make it for the holidays. I sure wanted to get to Las Vegas to see my family and all.

I spent my Christmas eve and Christmas day in the forward areas of central Vietnam, and believe me a laugh or two did the G.I.'s a lot of good out there.

The war was very quiet due to the stop firing agreement I am sure the fellows could use the rest. However, the weather in the area was very rainy and cold and the wind in the mountain tops kept us from landing the helicopters.

We went to places like LZ Two Bits, LZ Dog, Round Mountain, and various other names tacked on by the military. These are men who seek and destroy the enemy and believe me they cover every hole in the ground.

The American soldier in the field is a far cry from the youngster we knew at home. It is almost unbelievable what the ground soldier will go through with no thought of life or death.

It has been most gratifying to be here with them, as they treated me like a Bob Hope. At present I am in Quin Nohn on the coast, and entertaining in the valleys from this point. There are over eighty units that use shows and the audiences are unbelievable.

The living conditions for entertainers are not good, but when I think of how the G.I.'s live and what they are doing, I give it no second thought.

I will be home in latter part of April, or early May, so I will look forward to seeing you again. I am feeling much better now, after being run-down, but I am getting my energy back. I miss my family dreadfully and it is difficult adjusting at times. But it is a great experience here, and I have become so well known, I feel almost at home when I walk through the military areas.

It is good to have friends, especially fine people like yourselves. I will try to get some pictures to you as soon as I can.
