

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

PARIS (WNS) -- President Habib Bourguiba of Tunisia renewed his repeated charges that the leaders of the Arab countries were pursuing an unrealistic policy toward Israel, and he urged again that the Arabs should recognize Israel's existence.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Saboteurs struck at the Eltah-Ashdod oil pipeline but loss of oil from the damages was reported as insignificant. The action, in which one saboteur was killed, marks the first time that the pipeline was used as a target.

NEW YORK (WNS) American and Canadian Jews will provide a major share of Israel's \$289,000,000 Development Budget this year through the sale of Israel Bonds, it was learned when more than 400 Jewish leaders approved a decision by the 1968 planning conference of the board of governors of the Israel Bond Organization to consider maximum financial participation.

ROME (WNS) -- Informed sources noted that Cardinal Franjo Saper, the new prefect of the Holy Congregation for Doctrine and Faith, a key post in the Vatican Curia, had been one of the staunchest supporters of the declaration repudiating the charges of genocide against Jews in the crucifixion of Jesus, which was adopted at the Second Vatican Council in 1965.

NEW YORK (WNS) United Hias Service, envisaging the need of providing migration and other services to more than 50,000 Jews throughout the world, has adopted a 1968 budget of \$2,375,000, it was announced here by the agency's president, Carlos L. Israels, who said "new and vital resettlement needs" have created as a result of the Six-Day War.

HAIFA (WNS) -- Maj. Gen Yitzhak Rabin, retiring chief of staff of Israel's armed forces, told the officers and crewmen of two Israeli naval units that they now "have new tools which you did not have hitherto" and that their ability to use those tools "will make the Navy an important factor if another war breaks out."

NEW YORK: Tuwiah Friedman, the man who hunted down and brought to justice Adolf Eichmann, author of THE HUNTER, will be engaged in a lecture tour throughout the United States.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- French President Charles De Gaulle has declared that he intended no disparagement of the Jewish people in the press conference in Paris on Nov. 27 which has been the subject of furor ever since.

French sources stated that his was the first time in the nine years that the General has been in power that he has "apologized" for any of his statements.

In his speech of reply to the tributes paid him, Mr. Eshkol declared that he had come away from his meeting with President Johnson last week "deeply convinced of his understanding of our problems and of his friendship. This feeling has been strengthened in my present visit. I say this in relation to the bilateral relations between our two countries and I say this also in regard to our common approach to the crucial problems of peace in our area and in the world. . . . We do share a common outlook in regard to the most fundamental matters of importance to mankind."

The Prime Minister reiterated his country's desire for permanent peace in the Middle East. "We are not a warlike nation," he said, reaffirming Israel's willingness to negotiate a permanent Middle East settlement in face-to-face talks with its neighbors.

However, the General did not retract his basic remarks on Israel's "responsibility" for the June war.

ISRAEL AT SEA

HAIFA (WNS) -- The Israeli Navy is rushing production of a "substantial number" of fast boats that, it contends, can outsee, outmaneuver and outshoot the Russian-designed Egyptian gunboats of the type that sank the Israeli destroyer Eltah three months ago.

OPENS TIN CURTAIN

LONDON (WNS) -- A Russian scientist, a chemist who also writes poetry, has fled to England.

Dr. N. Gourevich, a chemist from Riga who writes poetry under the pen name of Naum Odnopozov, was on his way to Israel when he was detained and questioned by Soviet security police seeking to discover the identity of Odnopozov who was being sought on charges of distributing anti-Soviet literature.

NEW YORK: "It is morally indefensible that the Navy's Cruiser Destroyer Force Atlantic ordered American sailors to comply with a policy of discrimination against Italians, Negroes and Jews adhered to by many of the carnival balls at the New Orleans Mardi Gras Festival next month," Bertram H. Gold, Executive Director of the American Jewish Committee said.
