No Truth To GOP Reports

WASHINGTON ! (WNS) Sharp denial of reports that the recent Texas talks between President Johnson and Prime Minister Levi Eshkol of Israel were tied to the war in Viet Nam and that the Israeli Prime Minister at the behest of the President sought to influence American Jewish leaders on the war issue was made here by Israeli officials who termed the charge unfounded and absurd. "It is inconceivable," these officials said, "that

the Israel Government would handle matters of vital importance to the security of its people on such a basis. The Prime Minister would clearly limit to an exposition of Israel's own problems (Continued on Page 2)

Eshkol Tour Very Helpful

TEL AVIV (WNS) Prime Minister Levi Eshkol, returning from a tour that brought him to the United States, Canada and England, declared that his visits to those countries were "very worthwhile, important and helpful" though "we did not always receive a positive reply to what we said or wfatwe wanted."

To understand what has been achieved in the talks with President Johnson and British Prime Minister Harold Wilson, Mr. Eshkol said, one must read the official communques "between the lines," adding "we cannot complain and the future will prove it." The Prime Minister was obviously reluctant to speak publicly about his diplomatic junket until he reports to his Cabinet.

On his departure from London, Mr. Eshkol told newsmen that the 20-year ban on Israell shipping was "long enough and we are not prepared to tolerate such a ban any longer," that Israel has not despaired of peace but "will not be satisfied with plous and obscure promises," that Israel would not accept surpervision of her frontiers and that Israel will not indefinitely tolerate Arab terrorism and sabotage on her territory.
