

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK: - Max M. Fisher of Detroit, distinguished communal and civic leader and nationally prominent industrialist, has been named chairman of the 1968 national Annual Meeting of the American Jewish Committee by Morris B. Abram, President. The 62nd Annual Meeting of the country's pioneer human relations agency will take place May 23-26 at the Americana Hotel in New York City.

NEW YORK-- The "Olam Hadash Magazine" for children was hailed by Governor Nelson Rockefeller on its seventh anniversary for having "played a major role in the preservation of the rich, prophetic background and ancient Hebraic cultural heritage of Judaism in America".

JERUSALEM (WNS) Advocates of incorporation of all occupied Arab territories into Israel sought to present a petition to Knesset but turned away in anger when Speaker Kaddish Luz refused to seat an unduly large delegation of the "Greater Israel" movement. Among the nationally known figures in the movement are Nobel Laureate S. Y. Agnon and the widow of the second President of Israel, Mrs. Rachel Ben-Zvi.

HAIFA (WNS) A still unborn baby, conceived out of wedlock, was legitimized by the Haifa Rabbinate in a ruling believed to have no precedent in halachic law.

KIEL (WNS) Franz Josef Mueller, former SS leader, was sentenced to life here following trial and conviction on charges of involvement in the mass murder of Jews during World War II.

BONN (WNS) An indication that the member states of the Arab League are not averse to resuming diplomatic relations with West Germany was given here by league representative Zoher Kabbani in an interview with the German Agency.

NEW YORK (WNS) The society of the Founders of the American Friends of the Hebrew University has announced that its 1968 S. Y. Agnon Gold Medal Award will go to Nathaniel L. Goldstein, former Attorney General of the State of New York.

MELBOURNE (WNS) When the Jews of this city trekked to their synagogues on Purim they little suspected that Hamans in their midst were running amok, painting swastikas and desecrating sacred walls with Nazi-like verbiage.

BONN (WNS) Foreign Minister Willy Brandt coupled a demand for a court test of the legality of the National Democratic Party with a charge that neo-nazism was treason to the country.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Twice as many students are now enrolled in courses given by the Hebrew University's Department of American Studies than last academic year.

PARIS (WNS) The "legitimate aspirations of the Jewish people to recover their dignity cannot be ignored," President Habib Bourgiba of Tunisia was reported to have asserted on his recent visit here.
