The recent United Nations Security Council resolution condemning Israeli military action against Jordanian terrorists is deplorable and unrealistic in light of true conditions there.

It is ridiculous to expect Israel to sit idly by and submit to provocative border attacks, deliberately planned raids by Arab saboteurs, and terrorist violence.

The United Nations has demonstrated its inability to maintain peace in the area. The Arabs have not respected the United Nations, nor abided by it. It seems unreasonable therefore to expect Israel to do nothing to protect.

The road to peace is not going to be enhanced by Israel's blind submission to repeated attacks of provocation. Peace will come only when the Arabs are finally made to realize that they cannot continue to make a target of Israel with

impunity.

But aside from the failure of the United Nations, it seems high time that the United States itself stop the diplomatic double talk and take a firm stand for our proven friend and ally.

It is time the United States give weight to truth and morality and lasting peace -- Instead of merely counting the oil drums of the Middle East.

\$25,000,000 For 500,000 Lives

LONDON (WNS) John Alexander Sinclair, former

British Consul in China says in a letter to the Sunday Observer that the Nazis "offered to expatriate all the remaining half million Jews in Germany in German ships at German expenses with the tools of their trade to a value of ten pounds sterling a head," or the equivalent of \$25,000,000.

According to Sinclair, the offer was made to him in 1938 in Berlin while he was on leave from China. Sinclair says he reported the offer to Sir Frederick Leith-Ross, then chief economic advisor to the British Government, who replied the government would consider the proposal and pass it on to other powers if it was made through the usual diplomatic channels.

Sinclair claims he conveyed this message to Berlin.

Israel Debating Guerrilla Raids

TEL AVIV (WNS) Counter-terrorist measures aimed at curbing incursions by Arab marauders from Jordan are being contemplated by Israel, Chief of Staff Maj. Gen. Chaim Bar-Lev indicated.

Declaring that he had no "magic formula to solve the problem" of Arab terrorism, General Bar-Lev said Israel "has other means in its possession to fight El Fatah besides the conventional methods. It was made

against the background of reports that the question of using the same methods employed by the terrorists had been debated in the Cabinet.

War Any Minute

The seriousness of the situation in the Middle East is so acute, war is apt to break out at any minute, if it hasn't already as you are reading this column, which was written two days ago.

The threats of the Arab countries, which have always been extremely ominous in a general manner of expression, are beginning to boast of facts and figures calling for action in the immediate future. This is all in keeping with the time-table for the commencement of open hostilities, set by the Russians for the month of April, as reported recently in the Israelite.

There are many reasons, from several different avenues of approach, that support the authenticity of the report. The only possibility of delay or postponement of the scheduled Arab attacks could be charged to the retaliation of Israeli forces last month by wiping out guerrilla headquarters in Jordan. This led to the ridiculous resolution of the United Nations condemning Israel, which gave added comfort and security to the Arabs in subsequent actions and words.

To begin with, there has not been the slightest abatement of the sneaky infiltrations since the UN resolution, and the Arab boasts are becoming louder and stronger.
