

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON - B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations is accepting applications from congregational and campus rabbis seeking grants for specialized research or study. Information and applications are available from B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations, 1640 Rhode Island Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C. 20036.

WASHINGTON - More than 3,400 jobs in Jewish communal service are going begging for lack of qualified personnel. These figures were cited in two occupational opportunity guides published this week by B'nai B'rith Vocational Service to advise Jewish high school and college students on careers in Jewish communal service and Jewish education.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (WNS) Ambassador Yosef Tekoah of Israel, in a letter to the Security Council dealing with most recent events along the Israel-Jordanian border, declared that Jordan must take steps to halt the "continuous acts of aggression" against Israel.

LONDON (WNS) Saudi Arabia's reneging on its previous acceptance of Horace Phillips as its new Ambassador from Britain has triggered sharp denunciation by the British press, which generally regarded the development a clear instance of anti-Semitism.

LONDON (WNS) The tune in the Middle East crisis currently is being called by the terrorists and the El Fatah saboteurs rather than by King Hussein of Jordan, it was reported to the Daily Mail by its correspondent in Amman who said the King's days would be numbered if he attempted to curb or contain them. Also, in the opinion of the correspondent, Israel virtually no longer regards King Hussein as "the one moderate voice in the babble of Arab extremism," looking on him instead as "Israel's enemy number one."

NEW YORK (WNS) An outdoor Seder, sponsored by the New York Jewish community Council Coordinating Committee, was held here on the eve of Passover on a sidewalk adjacent to the building occupied by the Soviet Mission to the United Nations by way of symbolizing Jewish demands for freedom for the Jews in the Soviet Union.

NEW YORK (WNS) Sharp rejection of the charge in Poland that ORT had been engaged in espionage was made here by Dr. William Haber, president of the American ORT Federation, who said the accusation was "utterly preposterous and without a scintilla of truth."

NEW YORK (WNS) Dissociation of the Jewish Advisory Board of Columbia University from a statement by Rabbi A. Bruce Goldman that he could accept "meaningful" premarital sex relations between students was demanded by the Rabbinical Alliance of America, an Orthodox rabbinic body.

LONDON (WNS) Acceptance of an offer by the Government of Israel to support two new academic posts, one in Israeli studies and the other in Hebrew literature, was announced this week by the University of Glasgow.

DOVER (WNS) The captor of Reich Marshal Herman Goering at the end of World War II, Army Lieutenant Jerome N. Shapiro, died here of a heart attack at the age of fifty.

HAMILTON, N.Y. (WNS) Phi Delta Theta of Colgate University here has been censured by the faculty for practicing discrimination against a Jew.

NEW YORK (WNS) A call for a comprehensive Federal program to "banish inequality, injustice and poverty" from the land was sounded here by the National Community Relations Advisory Council in a resolution which said that its nine affiliated major national Jewish agencies and their members were prepared "willingly to assume whatever share" of the economic costs the program may entail.

LONDON (WNS) Although the Cultural Association of Polish Jews has bowed to government pressure in a statement projecting the official line that Zionists in Poland were responsible for the recent wave of student unrest in that country, it has again come under fire, this time for a "sin" of omission. The "sin", according to a commentator on a recent Polish television program, consisted in the association's failure last summer to immediately condemn Israel's aggression.

WASHINGTON (WNS) An assurance that Jews who are intimately linked with Israel and do not feel fully at home in Poland would be permitted to leave, coupled with a promise that he would ask his government to see what could be done about speeding up the issuance of passports to Polish Jews wishing to come to the United States, was

given here by the Polish Ambassador, Jezy Michalowski to a delegation of the American Jewish Committee which urged expediting of emigration facilities for Jews wishing to leave Poland.

WASHINGTON (WNS) The outbreak of rioting following the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., is believed by Jewish sources here to have brought many Jewish businessmen in the stricken cities to the brink of economic ruin.

NEW YORK -- American and Canadian college students-members of the Student Zionist Organization -- began a campaign to plant a special woodland in honor of General Yitzhak Rabin, Israel Ambassador to the United States.

SAN FRANCISCO: --President Lyndon B. Johnson has acclaimed the National Jewish Welfare Board and its affiliated Jewish Community Centers and YM & YWHAs for setting an example in "constructive civic involvement" through their "creative participation in our domestic effort to build a better society."

NEW YORK -- Twenty five, white doves, each symbolizing a year in the 20 year life of the modern State of Israel, will be released from the reviewing stand during the Salute to Israel Parade, here April 28.

WASHINGTON -- A traveling exhibit of more than 100 photographs and documents unearthed in the ruins of the Warsaw Ghetto or captured from the Nazis after the war is being offered for public showings throughout the country as part of the 25th commemorative of the Warsaw Ghetto uprising.

NEW YORK - More than 300 leaders of the country's 25 major American Jewish organizations met in profound mourning for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as they opened the two-day biennial meeting of the American Jewish Conference for Soviet Jewry at the Waldorf Astoria.

LONDON (WNS) The anti-Jewish campaign in Poland is unabated and the indications are it may be extended to elements not directly associated with the government either as officials or employees. The latest victim is Hirsch Smoliar, editor of the Warsaw Folksstimme, Yiddish daily and official organ of the Cultural Association of Polish Jews.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Of the 23,000 immigrants who entered Israel in the past twelve months, 2,000 were from the United States and 2,500 from South America.

WASHINGTON (WNS) More than 1,000 Jewish merchants, shopkeepers and property owners suffered heavy losses in the recent race riots in the District of Columbia.

NEW YORK (WNS) Legislation will be introduced in the Austrian Parliament to amend the existing reparations laws with a view to eliminating inequities against many of the victims of nazism, Austrian Chancellor Josef Klaus has told a delegation of the Conference of Presidents of Major Jewish Organizations.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Elisha Elath, retiring president of the Hebrew University, has been named president of Mogen David Adom, Israel's national Red Cross service.

LONDON (WNS) An emergency resolution calling on the Government of Poland to halt the current anti-Jewish campaign was adopted here by the Bureau of the Socialist International.

BRUSSELS (WNS) United Nations Secretary General U Thant, on his official visit to Belgium, voiced concern over the lack of progress towards a peaceful solution of the Middle East problem.

TEL AVIV (WNS) An artillery duel in the northern sector of the Jordan Valley has been reported by an Israeli military spokesman, who said the clash was triggered by Jordanian units.

LONDON (WNS) The United States is prepared to admit Polish Jews leaving the country because of the recent anti-Jewish campaign, it was disclosed here by the Sunday Times in a report which said the State Department so advised Senator Robert Kennedy in response to a letter of inquiry.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israel's highest honor, the Israel Prize, will be awarded to former Premier David Ben Gurion for his lifetime work. Presentation of the award will be made by President Zalman Shazar at a ceremony marking Israel's observance of Independence Day.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Deputy Minister of Development Yehuda Shaari has announced renewal of a trade pact with Turkey.

NEW YORK (WNS) Mrs. Pearl Wilien, immediate past president of the National Council of Jewish Women and a leading figure in the struggle for human and civil rights, died at the age of 64 in an automobile accident in Kenya.
