It doesn't seem possible, but a year has already passed since I was elected to the Temple Presidency. In accordance with our Constitution, the membership will hold its annual meeting for the purpose of electing five members to the Board of Directors. This meeting will take place on Sunday evening, May 19, 1968 at 8:00 PM in our Social Hall.

One of the privileges of membership in any organization is the right to vote for candidates of one's choice. I urge you to take advantage of this privilege. Our Temple Board consists of people who are dedicated and devoted. They give of themselves readily and eagerly. Their task is frequently a thankless one but their reward is derived from the knowledge that all's well with the Temple, and that they have a share in keeping it so. The membership determines who their representatives will be each year. It is vitally important therefore that all members come to the annual meeting and exercise their right to vote.

The Temple asks only one thing of its members; namely, that accounts should be paid up-to-date. In order to

vote a member must be in "good standing". I hope you will see it that you are "a member in good standing" so that you will be able to come to the Annual Meeting, hear the reports and then participate in the elections of the five members to the Board of Directors.

I take this opportunity to extend to you and yours my best wishes for an enjoyable and meaningful summer.

NEW YORK, West German parliamentarians, worried over the recent success of the neo-Nazi National Democratic Party (NPD) in Baden Wuerttemberg, are considering three measures in an effort to prevent the NPD from entering the German Bundestag (lower House of Parliament) when national elections are scheduled for early fall of 1969, according to information received here by the American Jewish Committee. The three proposed measures are:

1. Dissolve the coalition government of the Christian Democratic Union and the Socialist Democratic Party so that one of these two large parties would be able to attract the votes of the malcontents now veering toward the NPD;
2. Adopt election rules that would prevent small parties from entering the Bundestag;
3. Outlaw the NPD.

Analyzing the impact of the April 28th Landtag (state) election in Baden Wuerttemberg, in which the NPD rolled up 400,000 votes, 9.8 per cent of the total, a report by AJC's European office, made public today, said:

"It is premature as yet to make any forecasts as to which of these possibilities has the chance of being adopted by the three major parties; but there is no doubt (Continued on Page 2)

WHY RUSSIA SENT ITS ARMY

VIENNA (WNS) A woman commentator on Radio Prague called for renewal of diplomatic relations with Israel, according to reports reaching here from Czechoslovakia.

In calling for renewal of relations with Israel, the broadcaster said that such a move could add to the rising prestige of Czechoslovakia in the world and enable it to play a positive role as mediator in the Arab-Israel conflict. In addition, she called the breaking of relations with Israel by the com-

munist bloc last summer illogical and unnecessary. She posed the question why the communist bloc did not break diplomatic ties with France when it warred on Algeria, with the United States over the war in Vietnam or at the time of the 1956 attack on Egypt. Concluding the broadcast, she said that the hostility displayed toward Israel by the communist bloc of nations only served to draw her more tightly to the capitalistic world even though it is a progressive nation.

line between the two countries.

Victims of the latest series of terrorist activities were three Israeli soldiers who were killed when their command cars struck roadmines in the Romani area of northern Sianai. Seven others were wounded.

Earlier, El Fatah units launched a mortar attack in the Beisan, Jerusalem and Manera regions, but there were no casualties. At Kfar Rupin and Ashdod Yacov, in the Beisan valley, the mortar fire exploded harmlessly in a field, sending children into bombshelters for an hour. Northwest of Jerusalem, in the religious quarter of Mattarasorf, the terrorists dropped six mortar shells, while at Manera their shells dropped harmlessly in an apple or-
