DAYAN WARNS ARABS PREPARING FOR ANOTHER ROUND:

TENSION IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM (WNS) The Arabs are preparing for another round with Israel, but will not launch it unless they are sure of Soviet backing, Minister of Defense Moshe Dayan cautioned in a radio interview in which he discussed the tension in the area.

Declaring that he did not think a new war would break out in a matter of months, Gen. Dayan said Israel, if necessary, could wage war against the Arabs, combat terrorist activities and administer the occupied territories for years to come. He observed however that, under those circumstances, the people in Israel would have to sacrifice their expanding economy and pull their belts in so as to meet the demands upon manpower and the national resources.

And at Tel Aviv, Chief of Staff Haim Bar-Lev declared in an order of the day to the armed forces that while the Six Day War of last June did not solve all

the problems, it reduced the danger to the existence of Israel. The order was issued in connection with the observance, according to the Hebrew calendar of the anniversary of the war.

Meanwhile it has been disclosed that an Israeli soldier was killed and another wounded in a hand-to-hand clash with an El Fatah gang near Jericho, with three of the saboteurs suffering fatal injuries. Three others, apparently wounded, were dragged across the border.

In Jerusalem, where the first anniversary of the reunification of the city was observed in a subdued atmosphere, Premier Levi Eshkol assailed the U.N. Security Council resolution, reiterating that Jerusalem will always remain a united city. The observance was held at a special session of the city's Municipal Council. . . This and prayers of thanksgiving at the Wailing Wall were the only official events.

Wanted Nazis Flourish in Brazil

NEW YORK (WNS) Press reports reaching here from Sao Paulo say that a colony of German Nazis that is flourishing in a remote town in Southern Brazil was harboring two of the most wanted Nazi war criminals.

According to the reports, based on disclosures by a member of the local security police, the colony is located in a town of about 7,000 residents along the Parana River across the border of Paraguay.

The security official, who called the colony a "Fourth Reich," was quoted as having said that two most wanted Nazi criminals living in that area were Martin Bormann, Hitler's deputy and most elusive of Nazi war criminals, and Dr. Joseph Mengele, notorious as the angel of death in the Auschwitz concentration camp, where he was selector of victims for the death ovens.

ANTI-SEMITIC POLES

LONDON (WNS) The Polish Ministry of Education has confiscated a number of books on Israel and Jewish themes and removed them from the international book exhibit in Warsaw, according to reports reaching here from informed sources.

Jewish Press Only Hope For American Jews Says BB Head

CHICAGO (WNS) The Jewish press is the only hope for reaching and educating vast numbers of American Jews who are today abysmally ignorant about their own community as well as Israel," Phillip M. Klutznick, prominent Jewish leader and former international president of B'nai B'rith, declared here at the 25th annual convention of the American Jewish Press Association.

Counseling the Jewish press to be more probing and to show courageous concern for the problems affecting American Jews, Mr. Klutznick warned that "ignorance of our present-day American Jewish community can destroy it even if we master all of our past history contained in the Bible."

The convention concluded with adoption of a series of resolutions, among them one calling attention to the dangers of anti-Semitism "from the right or leftwing extremists." At the same time the parley called for increased aid to Israel. The association also recorded satisfaction with the statements of the various presidential candidates pledging aid and assistance to Israel.

Adolph Rosenberg, editor and publisher of the South-

ern Israelite of Atlanta, Georgia, was re-elected president and James Wisch of the Texas Jewish Post, Jules B. Miller of the Philadelphia Jewish Exponent and Joseph

L. Cummins of the Los Angeles B'nai B'rith Messenger were named vice-presidents. Albert W. Blum of the Pittsburgh Jewish Chronicle was elected treasurer.

CHRISTIANS SHOULD FACE ISSUE

NEW YORK (WNS) The emerging situation in the Middle East is "much like the one that preceded the Six-Day War of last year," a noted Christian educator declared in an address in which he said that Gentile and Christian opinion seems only interested in the question of boundaries and related problems when the "real issue" in "this grave situation" is "the threat" to annihilate Israel and its Jewish populace.
