WARNS ARABS PREPARING FOR ANOTHER ROUND:

JERUSALEM (WNS) The Arabs are preparing for another round with Israel, but will not launch it unless they are sure of Soviet backing, Minister of Defense Moshe Dayan cautioned in a radio interview in which he discussed the tension in the

Declaring that he did not think a new war would break out in a matter of months, Gen. Dayan said Israel, if necessary, could wage war against the Arabs, combat terrorist activities and administer the occupied territories for years to come. Wanted Nazis Flourish in Brazil American Jews Says BB Head NEW YORK (WNS) Press

reports reaching here from Sao Paule say that a colony of German Nazis that is flourishing in a remote town in Southern Brazil was harboring two of the most wanted Nazi war criminals.

According to the reports, based on disclosures by a member of the local security police, the colony is located in a twon of about 7,000 residents along the Parama River across the

border of Paraguay. The security official, who called the colony a "Fourth Reich," was quoted as having said that two most wanted Nazi criminals living in that area were Martin Bormann. Hitler's deputy and most elusive of Nazi war criminals, and Dr. Joseph Mengele, notorious as the angel of death in the Ausschwitz concentration camp. where he was selector of victims for the death ovens.
