NASSER ORDERS MOBILIZATION OF ARMED FORCES

ARAB WAR JULY 10

LONDON (WNS) President Nasser of Egypt has ordered the mobilization of all armed forces and the Egyptian Minister of Defense has issued a directive calling on senior commanders to have all units in a state of readiness by July 10 for a confrontation with Israel.

This disclosure was made in the Evening Standard by Jon Kimche, noted journalist and expert on Middle Eastern Affairs, on the basis of what he called a "secret memorandum" by President Nasser. Egypt expects to have on its side Syria, Iraq, Jordan and the Soviet Union.

ISRAEL READY FOR WAR

TEL AVIV (WNS) Continued support by the Arab states of terrorist incursions into Israel "is a matter of very serious political consequence to us and we can not let them get away with it." Minister of Defense Moshe Dayan asserted in a broadcast over the Armed Forces radio.

est doubt that if war comes "we shall not only defeat them, but we shall smite them hip and thigh, together or separately, every single country that wages a war of terror against us."

Declaring it was intolerable to permit states that signed cease-fire pacts with Israel to continue their hostile activities either directly or indirectly, Gen. Dayan warned that "if Jordan and Egypt want war, they are welcome to it, but then there can be no cease fire," adding that he hadn't the slight-

Meanwhile Israel is speculating the meaning of what have described as a sudden escalation of attacks by Jordanians on the East Bank. The recent spate of incidents, is viewed here by informed sources as a possible indication that the government of Jordan has lost control over its unit commanders along the demarcation lines. If that is a fact, it is feared the situation could lead to more serious clashes and unpredictable consequences.

May He Rest in Peace

While we do not condemn all Arabs for the depraved act of one we fear the unfortunate death of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, on June 6, 1968, is not the isolated performance of a man but the commencement of a pattern of violence against persons of prominence who sympathize with the Israeli cause.

At this writing, less than 24 hours after the 42-year-old presidential aspirant was gunned down following a victory speech in the California primary, an expression of the circumstances should include deep, sincere and heartfelt prayer for the father of 10, who met an untimely death. May he rest in peace.

Let us analyze the ramifications of this horrendous deed. At this early stage, the information released by the Los Angeles police on the alleged assailant, is scanty and qualified in every respect, even his name, Sirhan, Sirhan, 24, was born in the Jerusalem under Jordanian control, educated, close-mouthed, member of Arab League seen at communist front gatherings, under surveillance by F.B.I. etc., etc., etc.

Here we have a young man, whose native land has been viciously hostile to neighboring Israel for the past twenty years, since the day the Jewish state was created, who open aggression by Jordan and the other Arab countries against Israel failed, a pattern of continuous harassment

merican Zionist leaders from all over the country will attend the 27th World Zionist Congress to open in Jerusalem on Sunday evening, June 9, with addresses by President Zalman Shazar of Israel and Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Zionist Organization. Other scheduled speakers at the ten day 27th World Zionist Congress will include Prime Minister Levi Eshkol, Foreign Minister Abba Eban, Finance Minister Pinchas Sapir, Labor Minister Yigal Allon, Mayor Teddy Kollek of Jerusalem and Louis A. Pincus, chairman of the Jewish Agency.

In addition to the official voting delegates, there will be a number of invited guests and observers representing major American non-Zionist organizations and representatives of the American Jewish youth movements.

Also attending the Congress will be the members of the American Section of the Jewish Agency Executive, Mrs. Rose L. Halprin, chairman, Dr. Emanuel Neumann, Rabbi Mordecai Kirshblum, Dr. Joseph B. Schechtman, Miss Marie Syrkin, and Avraham Schenker, all of New York.

The Hadassah delegation of forty-one will be the largest of any of the Zionist groupings attending the Congress. Other groupings will be: Zionist Organization of America, 33; Labor Zionist Movement, 31; Religious Zionists of America (Mizrachi), 19; United Zionist Revisionists of America, 7; Americans for Progressive Israel, 5; American Jewish League for Israel, 3; United Labor Zionist Party; 3; B'nai Zion, 3.

The first World Zionist Congress was held in Basle, Switzerland, in 1897, at which there were 202 delegates meeting under the chairmanship of Theodor Herzl.

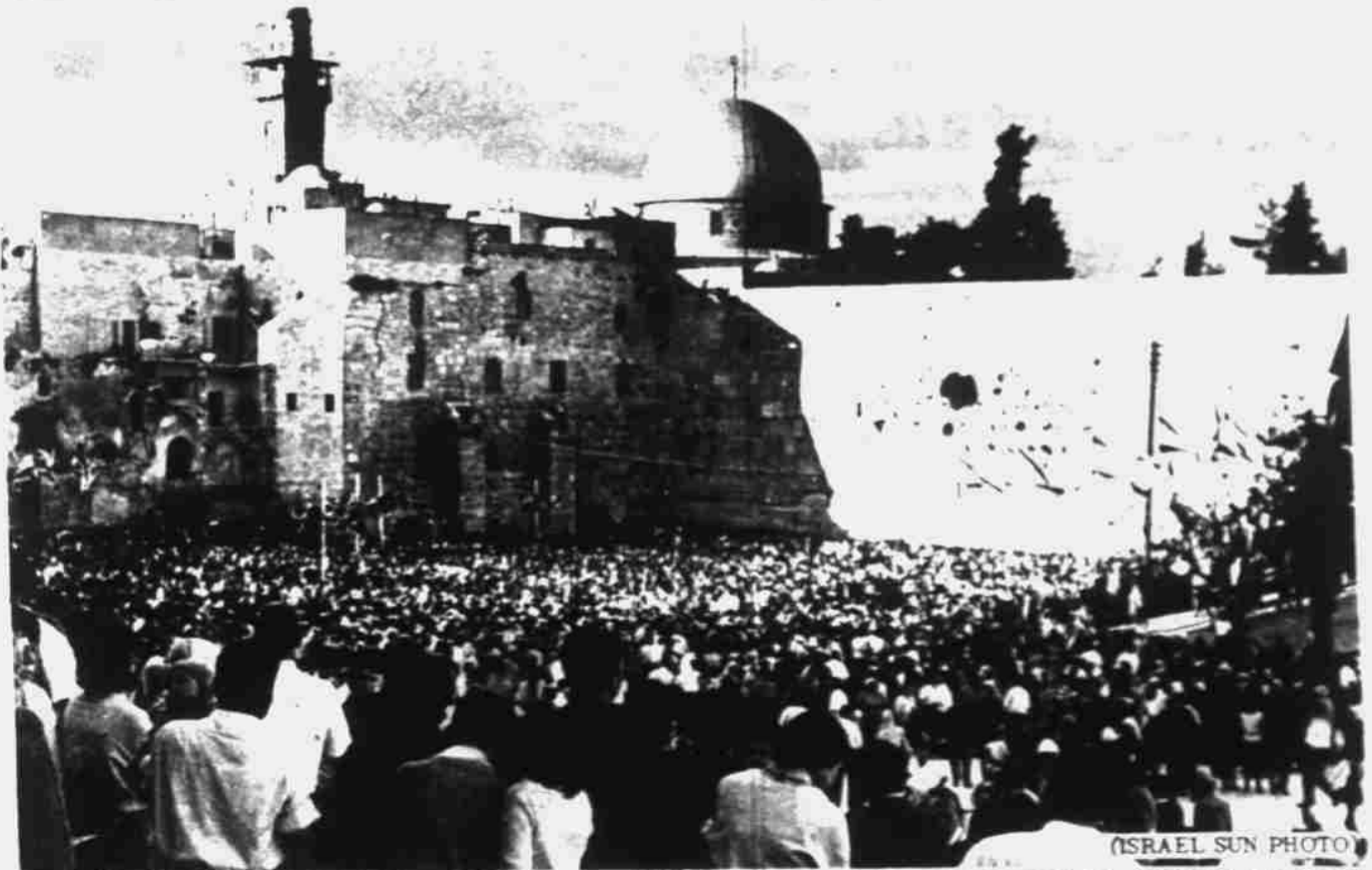
POLES NOT LETTING UP

LONDON (WNS) There are no signs of abatement in the Polish campaign against Jews, which is now reaching out to Jewish factory workers, educators and to all levels of Jewish participation, according to reports reaching here from reliable sources in Eastern Europe. Among the hundreds of victims in the current purge,

most are said to be Jews. The latest expeless from the party in Lodz were two Jewish professors and four textile workers.

Jewish sources here believe the situation of the Jews in Poland is rapidly deteriorating as the impact of the anti-Jewish campaign is seeping down to the mass level.
