1st Jew as Chief Justice

Complacency can be dangerous. So many of us are prone to accept world events with a shrug of the shoulders and let it go at that. This apathetic attitude can do terrible harm. Have we grown accustomed to problems to such a degree that we can accept them as inevitable and do nothing to correct them?

Perhaps I am personally somewhat more concerned than the average with the events which affect our brethren in Israel. I hope not. I hope that Israel's constant struggle for existence has affected every freedom loving citizen. In particular, I hope it has a daily impact on the life of every American Jew. I follow closely and carefully all news emanating from Jerusalem and Israel. The unfortunate truth is that peace in the Middle East is not yet in sight, and as long as there is no peace Israel remains in need of financial assistance from all Jewish people wherever they may be. What a great blessing it is that we here in the United States enjoy freedom as no other nation does. We are indeed twice blessed in that we have the opportunity to aid Israel in its quest for a position of dignity among its sister nations of the world.

There is an automobile commercial which says in song, "And the beat goes on." So it is with the need

to help Israel in its fight for survival. Millions of words have been spoken and written, all emphasize the unbelievable fact that Israel's victory in war only added to its myriad of problems. WASHINGTON (WNS) Associate Justice Abe Fortas of the Supreme Court has been named by President Johnson as successor to Chief Justice Earl Warren, becoming the first Jew in the history of the United States to be named to that post and the first to serve in that capacity if his appointment meets expected Senate approval.

Justice Fortas, the fifth Jew to serve on the Supreme Court, was preceded on that bench by Justices Louis D. Brandeis, Benjamin Cardozo, Felix Frankfurter and Arthur Goldberg, who resigned from the post to become U. S. Ambassador to the United Nations.

On being appointed to the bench in 1966, Mr. Fortas told newsmen he considered himself Jewish despite his lack of official affiliation with Jewish institutions and organizations. Since becoming a Justice, he has appeared as a speaker a number of times before Jewish organizations.

Born in Memphis, Tenn., on June 19, 1910, of Jewish parents, Mr. Fortas studied at Southwestern University and later at Yale. He first came to Washington as an attorney with President Roosevelt's New Deal administration, later becoming a close friend of President's Truman and Johnson.
