

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- Robert E. Sinton, president of the Jewish Welfare Federation of San Francisco, Marin County and the Peninsula, and a prominent San Francisco investment executive, has been named chairman of the Support and Development Committee of the National Jewish Welfare Board. It was announced here by Louis Stern, JWB president.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Refusal by Egypt and Syria to go along with a proposal to investigate the plight of the remaining Jews in those countries is the reason why U. N. Secretary-General U Thant has not named a special envoy to Israel to investigate the situation of the civilian population in the areas occupied by Israel since the Six Day War.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israel plans to abandon its 1967 go-slow economic policy for a large-scale economic expansion program this year even though such a course may lead to an increase in the foreign trade deficit.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israel may be compelled to give up part of the territory it occupied as a result of the Six Day War, but there can be no questioning of its right to hold on to all of Jerusalem, Minister for Religious Affairs Dr. Zerach Warhaftig declared here at a conference of Mizrahi-Hapoel Hamizrachi.

NEW YORK -- Ten leaders of the American Jewish Committee left for Bucharest, where they will attend festivities marking the 20th anniversary of the election of Dr. Moses David Rosen as Rumania's Chief Rabbi, as the first step on a trip that will bring them into contact with representatives of Jewish communities in six European countries.

NEW YORK (WNS) Sharp criticism was leveled here by Rep. Gerald Ford, a leading Republican at President Johnson for permitting the sale of strategic goods to a Poland that is swept by "a wave of anti-Semitism" under "the guise of anti-Zionism".

NEW YORK (WNS) Concern that "we Americans may not fully recognize the continuing and possibly growing peril in the Middle East," coupled with a warning that "the Russians, playing dangerous politics in the Middle East, are rearming the Arabs with even more modern aircraft and missiles," was voiced here by Undersecretary of Commerce Howard J. Samuels, who recently visited Israel as U. S. representative at the International Trade Fair in Jerusalem.

NEW YORK (WNS) The American Council of Judaism, sponsor of the visit to the United States of Chief Rabbi Yehuda Leib Levin of Moscow, has circulated a letter among its members calling for generous support to cover the expenses connected with the rabbi's visit and to enable it to "fruitfully cope with the opportunities of the months ahead.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Five convicted members of an Arab spy ring received stiff prison sentences at the hands of a military tribunal in Gaza, with the leader of the gang getting a total term of forty-nine years.

HAIFA (WNS) Ninety-eight Americans, most of them professionals who had jobs waiting for them, arrived the Greek liner Queen Anna Maria, seven of them renouncing all rights of foreign citizenship and being given new immigrant status. The rest of the newcomers were given temporary resident status. Ten in the group went off the to join various kibbutzim. Among the professionals was Prof. Franklin Vogelson, who will teach sociology at the Haifa University, and Moshe Saperstein, who will teach English at the newly formed American College in Jerusalem, a school for students from abroad.

ROME (WNS) Prominent Togloese citizens are naming their children after Israelis in gratitude for the training many of them have received at the Afro-Asian Institute in Tel Aviv, which is sponsored by Histadrut, Israel's federation of labor.

ROME (WNS) Prior charges that Israeli occupation occupation authorities were imposing death sentences on Arabs in the West Bank area were retracted here by two former Arab officials as they were subjected to sharp questioning at a press conference.

CHICAGO (WNS) Police in the suburb of Skokie are conducting an intensive hunt for the criminals who placed a bomb at the Hebrew Theological College there, smashing six large windows and causing other minor damage.

FALLSBURG, N.Y. (WNS) State Department action against Arab students on American college campuses who engage in vicious "campaigns of defamation against American Jews" was demanded here at the 32nd Annual Convention of the Rabbinical Council of America by its newly elected president, Rabbi Zev Segal of Newark, N. J.

REDS EGG ARABS

LONDON (WNS) The Soviet Union has advised the Arab countries that it was now prepared to proceed with a non-political approach to their re-acquisition of lost territory in their war with Israel last June, according to an article in the Evening Standard by the well-informed journalist Jon Kimche.

According to Kimche, Moscow has advised the Arabs that if Israel fails "to respect the Security Council resolution" of last November, the Soviet Union "would

have no alternative but to consider other steps to enable the Arab countries to regain their lost territory." Moscow did not however indicate what those steps would be. Moscow, according to the report, made its views known last week in a memorandum to the Arab countries. Hitherto the Soviet Union advocated a political solution of the issue.
