

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (LNS) - The 41st anniversary of the miraculous liberation of the late Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Joseph L. Schneerson, was marked by Lubavitcher followers and by world Jewry at large this year on Monday July 8.

NEW YORK - Dean Gershon Winer awarded nineteen Teacher diplomas and four Doctorates at the Herzliah Hebrew Teachers Institute-Jewish Teachers Seminary marking the first time in the fifty-year history of the college that doctoral degrees were conferred.

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Special) -- American Jews will be able to use Israeli Ethrogim for the Succos holiday after intervention by Agudath Israel of America caused the U. S. Department of Agriculture to lift its new regulations, which would have effectively banned the import of Ethrogim to this country.

NEW YORK - Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the American Zionist Council, told leaders of its nine constituent national Zionist organizations that the recently concluded 27th World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem "has, by its decisions, offered the American Zionist Movement an unprecedented and much needed opportunity to restructure itself into a unified movement which by its activities would for the first time be able to reflect the overwhelming support of the American Jewish community for Israel in a new organizational form, and American Zionist Federation."

JERUSALEM (WNS) The World Union for Progressive Judaism, at its first annual convention in Israel, sounded a call for full recognition of the Reform movement and its rabbinate.

NEW YORK (WNS) Rabbi Elmer Berger, Executive vice-president and principal spokesman for the American Council for Judaism since its founding in 1945, has resigned from the organization amidst indications of a deep split in the ranks of the rabid anti-Zionist group.

SAN FRANCISCO (WNS) Opposition to the use of public funds to assist sectarian schools was reaffirmed here by the National Community Relations Advisory Council as it concluded a four-day plenary session with the reelection of Jordan C. Band of Cleveland to the presidency for a second one-year term.

NEW YORK (WNS) A smash hit in Israel by the Yiddish poet Itzik Manger, "The Megillah," is to be produced this fall on Broadway, Oct 9, amidst indications that the play will receive the same acclaim here as it triggered in Israel when it was first shown in 1965.

BUCHAREST (WNS) Israel and the Arabs "must come together and talk peace directly," Mufti Yakub Mehemet, Moslem religious leader in Rumania, declared here at a stage luncheon in honor of Chief Rabbi Moses Rosen of Rumania marking the twentieth anniversary of his ascension to the office of chief rabbi.

JERUSALEM (WNS) A bid by the Union of Progressive Judaism, a Reform body congregated in convention here, to upset a Religious Ministry ruling against mixed prayers at the West Wall was turned down by Knesset when its interior committee voted to sustain the decision.

JERUSALEM (WNS) A proposal to change Knesset from a uni-cameral to a bi-cameral body was turned down in Parliament by a heavy vote. Advocates of change said a dual-chamber system would make it possible to advance senior members of parliament while enabling the inflow of young people into the legislative body. Some of the objectors to the bill said their negative vote did not mean opposition in principle but, rather, to its timing. They said they felt the matter should be given more study by Knesset.

GIARDINO, N.Y. (WNS) At the opening of the convention of the United Synagogue of America, representative body of 825 Conservative congregations in the U.S. and Canada, Onty Daniels of White Plains, N.Y., convention chairman, warned that Jews around the world were worried about a possible "sell-out" in peace negotiations that would ignore Israel's demands for Arab recognition and direct negotiations. Such agreements, he said, would only pave the way for future "greater and graver" warfare.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Three Arab saboteurs were killed by Israeli gun fire in an exchange in the Jordan Valley, it was disclosed here by army officials who said the intruders were using Soviet automatic rifles. There were no Israeli casualties. At the same time it was reported that two Israeli soldiers were wounded when their vehicle hit a concealed mine in the Syrian Golan heights. In Jerusalem, a fifteen-year-old boy was wounded in the face when he picked up an object that turned out to be a bomb.
