# ARAB FORAYS CONTINUE

JERUSALEM (WNS) Premier Levi Eshkol and Foreign Minister Abba Eban have both indicated existence of a wide range of understanding between the United States and Israel on the attainment of peace in the Middle East.

Mr. Eshkol aired this view at a cabinet meeting where he reported on the talks with George Ball, U. S. Ambassador to the U. N.

Mr. Eban projected that view in a radio interview in which he said that differences between Israel and the U. S. over the method of reaching peace with the Arabs were more apparent than real and that the U. S. did not believe in any permanent solution that was not based on a treaty signed directly between the Arabs and Israel.

Peace and how to attain it was also the theme of Minister of Defense Moshe Dayan, who told a labor rally in Haifa that Israel was closer to a settlement with the Arabs than ever before. However, he added, Israel must remain steadfast in purpose and be ready to carry on without peace if it cannot be attained. But above all, he noted,

Israel must insist this time on firm and binding terms on the normalization of relations, then we shall eventually achieve real peace."

While the Israeli leaders were speaking of peace, Arab saboteurs continued forays into Israel. One of the more serious clashes involved a group of saboteurs who were found carrying orders to abduct at least one Israeli, preferably a woman. The terrorists were intercepted while trying to cross the Jordan River. Three of them were killed and a fourth one captured. Another clash occurred on a road between Sodom and Eilat, where the intruders were preparing to ambush an Israeli vehicle. One Israeli soldier was wounded in the clash.

In another incident, a band of Arab terrorists attempting to penetrate an Israeli position near Damya bridge was driven back, escaping for cover to Jordan. One of the saboteurs was killed and three escaped. There were also a number of minor incidents, involving efforts to place mines along roads on which Israeli vehicles were passing.

## BLAME EGYPT FOR CASUALTIES

United Nations, N. Y. (WNS) Replying to an Egyptian complaint to the Security Council that Israel initiated the artillery duel in the Port Suez area of the Suez Canal on July 8, Ambassador Yosef Tekoah of Israel said that responsibility for the incident and its escalation has been placed on Egypt by UN truce ob-

servers.

Egypt filed its complaint in a letter to the current president of the council, Ambassador Twefik Bouattoura of Algeria. Egypt claimed that Israeli fire killed 46, wounded 67, destroyed a church, two mosques and a child welfare center.

Declaring that Egyptian aggression has been responsible for suffering and casualties to areas of civilian population, Mr. Tekoah said that both Israel and the Red Cross have deplored the "Egyptian practice of opening fire from artillery positions established in residential areas, and in particular in the vicinity of public institutions such as hospitals and schools." It is this practice, the Israeli diplomat added, that "is directly responsible for the civilian casualties."

Meanwhile it was disclosed that Ambassador Tekoah had been called to Jerusalem for consultations that are to begin early next month.
