Israel is always on my mind. The welfare of the State of Israel has become a vital part of my life, I know it concerns you as well, and so I would like to mention a few interesting facts on life in Israel today.

In June of 1967, a little over a year ago, Israel found itself burdoned with problems it had never sought. Victory in the Six Day War had resulted in control of areas which had to be ad-

ministered, even though there was no plan of any kind prepared. These areas include the West Bank and the Gaza Strip region. The reaction of the population in these areas has run the gamut from the shock of defeat to realization that the Israeli was not at all like Arab propagandist had portrayed him, but an ordinary person interested only in getting back to a normal life
