## Reid for Assembly

Harry Reid, Chairman of the Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees Friday filed for election to the Nevada State Assembly District No. 4. Reid is a former City Attorney of Henderson.

Reid is a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cancer Society and Legal Aid Society. He is Treasurer of the Clark County Bar Association and a Judge of the Nevada State Athletic Commission. He is a lifetime resident of Nevada.

**REID MADE** this statement when he filed:

"During the past two years the Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees has been involved in a constant struggle to improve the facilities and services of the hospital. We have established the only Burn Center in the State of Nevada, established an Inten-

## Political Hopefuls Kachulis for Assembly

### HAM FOR CONGRESS

Richard Ham, Democratic candidate for Nevada's only seat in the House of Representatives, this week continues taking his campaign to the people.

Ham, 44-year-old former chief aide to ex-Gov. Grant Sawyer, stated "It won't do Nevada a bit of good to elect a man to Congress who either ignores or favors any segment of the state's population," Ham said, "and I pledge equal representation for all our counties and their complex variety of problems."

In recent weeks Ham has been in every community of the state, meeting with campaign volunteers and discussing local and state-wide problems, Graham Hollister, Douglas County rancher who is chairman for 15 counties, said.

In Washoe County, educator Bob Cahill is chairman

of the Ham for Congress Committee and Mike Maini, Las Vegas businessman and civic leader, heads the Clark county drive.

Hollister said committees supporting Ham's candidacy have been established in each county, "with representatives of business, education, ranching and professional fields participating."

Ham's wife, Betty, and their two teenage children, James and Linda, have been campaigning throughout the state for the past month, visiting hospitals, rest homes and working door-to-door in several cities.

Las Vegas businessman Joseph Kachulis announced Friday his candidacy for State Assembly District 4.

Kachulis, a 28-year resident of Southern Nevada, said he supports gun legislation, which would require a seventy-two hour waiting period for character investigation.

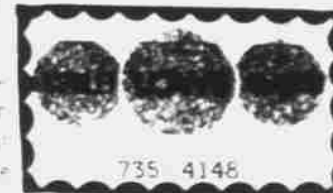
He also stressed the need for a state lottery, Nevada Southern University stadium, and a veteran's hospital.

He is currently a member of the Clark County District Board of Health and chairman of its legislative committee, and is national director of the National Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association.

He was a founding member of the Hospital Advisory Committee, a former member of the State Housing Commission, served as the chairman of the Governor's Committee for the eradication of Tuberculosis in Nevada, and is a past president of the Clark County TV & Health Association and of the Nevada TB & Health Association. Young has also served as a former PTA President, Vice President of the Charleston Par Improvement Association, and President of the B'nai B'rith.

In his filing statement Young stated "My many years of public service devoted to the health and welfare of our community plus my extensive experience in business management and accounting qualifies me as
