"I don't believe a man should be appointed because he is a crony of the President, or is from his home state," he said, "There are hundreds of people who have ample qualifications for the court."

It was the last statement by Raggio, that caused us to rehash this entire issue. Had he stuck to his original and sole reason for opposition, as reported in the press when he took his stand, of "cronyism" the Israelite would have refrained from comment and just published letters, as space permits, from the many that flowed in.

In commenting on the letters, we find two men whose opinions and judgements we respect as high as any in the state, the good Rabbi Frankel, finding Raggio "labeled" and 'branded" as an anti-semite by this writer, and Justice Dave Zenoff volunteering the opinion "disavowing" that Bill (Raggio)" is or has ever been an anti-semite."

Emanuel Berger, M. D., is disturbed over "implications" in our editorial, and Raggio's stand "should not stir up any religious and racial innuendoes." Dr. Berger, general chairman of UJA in northern Nevada, signs off with "yours for fairness in judging people."

A.s office over other applicants better qualifified. Raggio is not a "racist, honkie, or right wing lunatic" as we would describe him.

There you have it folks, all the "nice" comments his best friends up north are saying about Raggio, a man we'd never met, and therefore would never judge personally. Had we known him, and agreed with everything he's been described as, we'd still point out that the timing of his statement attracted every anti-Semite in the state to vote

Dear Mr. Tell:

Thank you for your telegram of July 19 asking my views on supersonic jets for Israel.

In my statement of July 11, 1968, I said that the real answer to the problems of the Middle East lies in agreed disarmament, and presented what I felt to be six necessary elements for a permanent peace in that area, I am enclosing a copy of my statement for your consideration,

I am sure that this policy, based on a sense of justice, concern for all the inhabitants of the Middle East and the long-range best interests of the United States, will be acceptable to everyone, even though we may not always agree as to the particular details of its implementation,

The full text of his statement follows:

"My position on Israel and the Middle East is clear. Ever since the creation of the State of Israel, which I enthusiastically supported -- both on moral and political grounds --I have felt that a stable peace in the Middle East is a

There are six necessary elements for a permanent peace in the Middle East:

1. The existence of the State of Israel must be accept-

ed by all of its neighbors: 2. The fragile, often-violated truce lines must be trans-

formed into agreed and secure boundaries; 3. The State of Israel must have free navigational rights in all International waters, including the Suez Canal and the Gulf of Agaba;

4. The arms race, which breeds insecurity as it feeds on hostility, must be finally terminated;

5. The international community must assist the countries immediately concerned in solving the human tragedy posed by the Arab refugees;

6. The resources of the Middle East countries must be used primarily for human and economic development
