Candice will attend Arizona State University as an education major in the field of science. Her mother, Millicent Gettle, is employed at the Silver Slipper.

Sahara, Apt #310, maintained a straight A average at Valley High School, ranking in the top 1% of his class. Martin will major in mathematical science at the University of Denver. His father, Louis Kravitz, is employed at the Sands.

The scholarship program was inaugurated recently for deserving children of Hughes employees, and recipients maintaining a straight "A" average the first year will automatically be granted tuition for a second year.

The issuance of scholarships is based on the following criteria: (a) a straight "B plus" or above average the last two years of high school; (b) applicants for scientific fields will be given to dependents of employees in the low income bracket; however, parents' total income is reconciled with the need for help in sending youngsters to college.
