

BOTH CANDIDATES FAVOR ARMS TO ISRAEL NATCH!

WASHINGTON (WSN) Vice-President Hubert Humphrey and former Vice-President Richard M. Nixon voiced strong American support of Israel, including military aid, at the triennial national convention here of B'nai B'rith.

Reiterating his position on continued American military aid to Israel, the Democratic Presidential nominee said while "arms control" was the real answer to the problem in the Middle East, Israel had a right to be strong enough to deter aggression and defend itself and that the U. S. "had a duty to respond favorably" to Israeli requests for defensive arms "on grounds of our own security interests."

The Republican Presidential candidate reiterated a statement he made in Houston to the effect that he favored the sale of U.S. Military jets to Israel. In Houston, Mr. Nixon said, "it would be a great threat to peace if Israel's neighbors, bent on war of revenge and smarting" from their defeat in the Six Day war, "are ever given the impression that they could launch a war with Israel and get away with it." At the same time the former Vice President noted that "if it takes Phantom jets, they should have Phantom jets."

In his presidential address, Dr. William Wexler told the 1,200 delegates that while there must be no ignoring or condoning of chauvinistic "Black Power" discrimination against Jews, Jews must have compassion for Negro aspirations. While defending the right of the black community to "remove the shackles and to share fully in the bounty of a society of freedom, equality and abundance, the B'nai B'rith president said "we cannot shrug off a practice of discrimination in reverse that ousts a Jewish school teacher or Jewish principle or

Jewish school administrator from the job in a ghetto neighborhood to satisfy the new Black Power criteria for self-segregation."

ED YOUNG IN FAVOR OF HOSP. PUBLIC BIDS

Ed Young, a successful primary candidate for the position of Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital Trustee, declared his approval of the majority decision of the Board of Hospital Trustees to put out, for public bid, the Employee Group Hospitalization Insurance contract.

Young, who just returned from the Convention of the National Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association in Coeur D'Alene, Idaho, where he represented Nevada, stated that "My policy has always been to put out for public bid all contracts when dealing with the taxpayers money. As long as this is a County Hospital, supported by the citizens of our community, and caring for it's indigent patients, this policy of 'Public Bid' must stand. I have consistently maintained the same position on the Clark County District Board of Health, of which I am a current member," stated Young.

At the same time, it is important to remember that there are certain basic tenets in Judaism, which are unchangeable and are as vital today as they were in ages come by.

Jews believed and can believe today in one universal God, one principal, one creative force that is responsible for all mankind. Jews believe and can still believe that the one universal God is an ethical God who demands that our relationships with one another be based on truth and justice, and that the sacredness and dignity of all human beings be respected. Jews believed and still can believe, that God insists upon human freedom, that no man shall have the right to dominate another, that human liberty is a person's inalienable right, and that democracy must be the ruling principle of society. Jews believe and still can believe that creed alone is not sufficient. Creed must be expressed through deed. Whatever we hold dear, whatever we love, honor and respect, needs to be shown by our actions. Jews believe and can still believe in being charged with the mission of teaching the meaning of God and religion among the peoples of the world, and that this mission be discharged not by preaching, not by theological stunts and not by intellectual feats, but by a living example in every sphere of daily life. Jews believed and still can believe in a Messianic age, the promise of a happier future, through the perfectibility of man, through the advancement of the human mind.

More than once it appeared as if Judaism had played out its role, its purpose and its relevance. Yet, it came back in full force. It came back in other forms but with the same essence which is eternal and essential to social progress, sane, sound living.

Jews more than any other people are by make-up socially minded. The idea of the great society was ever present in the mind of the Jewish people. It was the paramount goal of their existence, the very core of their mission. It was not a historical accident that Jewry gave rise to prophets who clamored for a society built on the foundation of justice, love, brotherhood, peace and equality. The voice of the prophet was simply the voice, the conscience of the people from whom they stemmed. At the same time, the voice of the people was always the voice of Judaism.

Yes, there is reason to hope, even in this depressing, discouraging period, that the Jews will yet return to the faith of their fathers. When the saturation point of negativism and estreatment will have been reached, Jews will surely awaken to the realization, that without an ideal life becomes void and empty. And, in pursuit of an ideal they will find that there is no greater, finer, more satisfying ideal than that which Judaism offers.

As we listen to the sound of the Shofar on the New Year - may we hear its call to return to the source of our strength - Judaism - that way of life which has preserved us through the ages, ennobled our own lives and has contributed to the enrichment of western civilization as a whole.
