

New Year Message

The past year has been one of unusual turbulence. We enter the New Year, 5729, with the hope that it will bring with it peace and harmony among all peoples of the world. In the Far East, in Europe, in Africa and in the Middle East -- as well as within our own borders -- there is continued conflict not in keeping with the aims and aspirations of a well ordered, civilized world.

As Jews, we are particularly saddened by the continued conflict in the Middle East, the result of the sabre-rattling of a Nasser whose refusal to officially recognize and sit down and negotiate a peace with Israel is leading the Arab states, and the world, along dangerous paths.

We are unhappy that the spectre of anti-Semitism and discrimination, some times under the false label of anti-Zionism, has appeared in Poland and other sectors behind the Iron Curtain. We lament the U.S.S.R.'s inexplicable refusal to grant to its Jewish citizenry the rights it bestows upon all other national and religious minority groupings.

As Zionists, we rededicate ourselves to the concept that Israel must not be allowed to stand alone, that American Jewry pledges itself to redouble efforts in its behalf. This involves a many-faceted program: the encouragement and development of a much needed western aliyah; the furtherance of a program of education, interpretation and understanding of Israel's problems in the world of nations; and

the continued support through the United Jewish Appeal, and other instrumentalities, of the great financial calls made upon the government of Israel and its people by the hundreds of thousands of under-privileged newcomers still not fully absorbed economically, educationally and socially, in their new homeland. Israel is still faced with challenges and staggering burdens that cannot, and should not, be borne by its citizens alone.

At home, we continue to labor for full equality of opportunity for all peoples in the best tradition of American democracy. We recognize that this is not a perfect world, but we strive for continuing progress that will place and keep the United States in the forefront of those nations committed to the democratic way of life.
