LOS ANGELES: - Veteran's ember 10, at 2:00 p.m. Day on Monday, November 11, will find the Jewish War Veterans of the United States participating in various types of programs to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the original Veteran's Day -- the ceasefire between the Central Powers and the Allies which marked the World War I armistice.

The major public event is the annual Sacred Torch Ceremony in the Court of Forest Lawn -Liberty, Hollywood Hills at 11:00 a.m. Three such ceremonies are held throughout the United States -- in Arlington, Virginia; St. Louis, Missouri, and Los Angeles.

The County of Los Angeles will hold its annual Veteran's Day program at the Sports's Arena under the direction of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, Chairman, County Board Military and Veteran Affairs Committee. National Executive Committeeman Herbert F. Rosoff will represent the National Commander of the Jewish War Veterans.
