JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (LNS) - Representatives of the Lubavitcher movement were among the first to greet the many Jews arriving in Vienna after fleeing Czechoslovakia.

LONDON (WSN0 - The first volume of "The Letters and Papers of Chaim Weizmann," a multi-volume project covering the career of Israel's first President, was published in an English adition by Oxford University Press. The general editor of the project is Meyer Weigsal, president of the Weizenmann Institute of Science in Rehovoth.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Yavneh, the Orthodox Jewish Students association, has published a College Guide for Jewish High School Students. The guide contains information on Jewish campus groups, Jewish dietary law and Sabbath observance.

LONDON (WNS) - The Board of Deputies of British Jews has called an antishechita campaign launched by a humane society an attempt "to deprive the Jewish community of its right to continue recognized humane and painless methods of animal slaughter. "The Board is 'giving urgent and serious consideration'' to the campaign being conducted by the "Council of Justice to Animals and Humane Slaughtering Association." The group was described as one of many "animal lovers" organizations which 'are constantly campaigning against stag hunting, vivisection and schechita.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - Dr. Gustav Heinemann, West German's Minister of Justice, who is visiting Israel as a guest of the Government, said that his Social Democratic Party would shortly take the initiative to postpone the effective date of the statute of limitations on war crimes prosecutions or to abolish the statute altogether. Dr. Heinemann has long favored abolishing the statute which is to take effect Dec. 31, 1969, after which new cases against war criminals involved in crimes or murder cannot be initiated.

WASHINGTON -- B'nai B'rith is producing record albums of distinguished Jewish authors reading from their own works. Long-playing albums featuring recordings by Maurice Samuel and Elie Wiesel, both winners of B'nai B'rith's Jewish Heritage Award for "excellence in Jewish literature," were released this week, and are available at \$4,95 through B'nai B'rith's Adult Jewish Education Department, 1640 Rhode Island Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20036.

AHTENS, O. -- Ohio University has added a credit course in Jewish literature and tradition to its curriculum and kashrut facilities to its dining hall. Rabbi Joseph Polak, B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation director at Ohio U., is teaching the five-credit course.

NEW YORK - Simon H. Fabian, a New York film executive long active in philanthropic affairs, has been elected Chairman of the National Campaign Cabinet of The Jewish Theological Seminary of America, it was announced by Rabbi Bernard Mandelbaum, Seminary President,

NEW YORK - The American JEWISH Conference of Soviet Jewry, comprising the twenty-five major national American Jewish Organizations, has announced the unamimous election as chairman of Lewis H. Weinstein, Boston lawyer, partner in the firm of Foley, Hoag & Eliot and community leader, to succeed Rabbi Israel Miller.

NEW YORK, - From Berkeley to Boston, eighty student representative of the newly established University Service Department of the American Zionist Youth Foundation are currently promoting the Israel presence on campuses in the United States and Canada, Campus representatives and their fellow students have established information booths in student union buildings to distribute material on programs in Israel.
