A month after Pearl Harbor, Lee enlisted as a private in the Infantry out of Fort Bliss, Texas. He served with the CIC (Counter Intelligence Corps) and thence to Ft. Benning Officers Infantry School.

In World War II, he worked for Counter Intelligence Corps, covered two Guatemalan revolutions, and was in Antigus above Guatemala City (the capital) when the 1952 revolution broke out.

Lee has covered the political front for most of the leading papers in the coun-


