In accepting the plaque, Mrs. Tracy felt that the Clinic was the real Man of the Year,


"It is important that the Clinic reaches parents early so that they can reach their children." said Mrs. Tracy. "We take children only from birth to six years of age; the earlier, the better. There no charge, although is parents may contribute. Children may not hear their parents but they learn early to understand movement of lips and to associate ideas.


