ISRAEL WEIGHS RETRIBUTION FOR ARAB GUERRILLA ATTACK ON EL AL PLANE AT ZURICH

The Israeli Parliament's Security Council met Wednesday at the home of Israeli Premier Levi Eshkol in Jerusalem to discuss Tuesday's Arab guerrilla attack on an El Al plane at Zurich. A cabinet member hinted at swift retribution.

INFORMED speculation in Jerusalem said the Israelis might strike against Damascus International Airport whose lights are within sight of the Israeli-held Golan Heights. The Arab commandos who machinegunned the plane in Zurich said they took off from Damascus airport.

The United States, Britain and United Nations Secretary General Thant appealed to Israel not to retaliate, but Israeli transportation min-

ister Moshe Carmel warned of unspecified consequences to Arab nations and the Arab Airlines.

"Our neighbors cannot expect us to tolerate a situation where Israeli civilian planes are attacked with impunity... while Arab civilian planes continue flying without disturbances as if nothing had happened," he said.

IN CAIRO, Mohammed Hassau El Zayat the official Egyptian spokesman, said Egypt expected an Israeli reprisal attack since "Israel's policy is government by terror."

An attack on the Amman airport was not ruled out. The Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine said its commandos carried out the Zurich attack and the front is headquartered in Jordan where the Israelis have

struck frequently against commando bases.

While the world wondered what the Israeli reaction would be new border clashes broke out today along the Israeli-Jordan cease-fire line. A spokesman in Amman said Israeli and Jordanian troops fought for 25 minutes along the northern Jordan Valley truce line. He said there apparently were "some" Israeli casualties, no Jordanian.

The Arab attack punctured the fuselage of the El Al Boeing 707 jetliner in scores of places and wounded six occupants. An airline security guard dashed from the plane through a hail of machinegun bullets and killed one of the attackers; he might have killed the others but was restrained by Swiss police who captured them.
