During these days between Purim and Passover, it would be well for each of us to pause and reflect on the welfare of our brethren in the State of Israel. Purim is classified as a "minor" holiday in Judaism. Yet the story of Purim, which tells of a fight for survival in another era, is as meaningful today as at any other time in history. I am sure you are all acquainted with the story of the lovely Queen Esther and the triumph of the Jewish people of ancient Persia, lead by Mordecai, over the tyrant Haman, then prime minister of the kingdom. One statement in the story, spoken by Mordecai to the Queen, stands out in my thoughts. He had asked the Queen to intercede in behalf of the Jewish people. When she expressed fear at appearing before the King, because it could have meant her life, Mordecai said, "Think not that you shall escape in the King's house more than all the Jews, for if you remain silent at this time, help and relief will come to the Jews from another source and you and

your father's house will be lost. And who knows whether you were chosen for royal estate for just such a time as this."

How appropriate these words in these times! Each of us in knowledgeable of what is going on in Israel today. Almost daily, newspaper headlines shout at us about Israel's problems with its hostile neighbors. This then is a time for rededication and clear thinking. The spirit of our ancient heritage must dominate our thoughts and deeds. If Israel's dignity and sanctity is to be upheld, then every Jewish person must rally to

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Mrs. Golda Meir, the former Milwaukee schoolteacher has accepted the premiership nomination of the Israel Labor Party and its coalition partners in the Government and is assured of being installed as the Fourth Prime Minister of Israel, possibly within a week.

In accepting the LLP de-

signation, Mrs. Meir, who will be 71 in June, pledged to maintain national unity and called on the members of the Government to "continue in the same framework."

Mrs. Meir's selection was viewed as an interim one until the Oct. 28 national elections. She has long been considered as the "strong man" of Israeli politics and one of the powers, if not the power, behind former Premier Levi Eshkol whom she served as leader of Israel's most powerful party, Mapai and its successor, the ILP. Mrs. Meir has also served as Ambassador to Moscow and as the Minister of Labor and Foreign Minister.

Mrs. Meir, who said very little about her becoming Prime Minister, is expected to indicate she will take the position now that all elements of the government have approved her selection.
