WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban has noted his Government's uneasiness over the Nixon Administration's diplomatic tactics in pursuit of Middle East peace formula as reports in Washington and the United Nations indicated that Big Four talks on the crisis are about to begin.

Eban met with President Richard M. Nixon and other members of his Administration in Washington and reportedly indicated the Israeli belief that any plan which would involve the Big Four as vital elements to a Mideast peace effort such as making them guarantors of an agreement would only globalize the conflict and make every Mideast incident a potential American - Soviet problem as in now the case

with Berlin.

While no one on the American side was discussing in detail what was said in the meeting between the representatives of the two nations, it was indicated that Jerusalem believes that war is not likely in the area no matter how much the Arab states try to present this picture to the world.

Israel also still views France as being inclined to the Arab cause and not neutral even though officials in Paris had tried to present another picture to Israeli officials. Nixon Administration officials had also indicated that the French position had moved closer to the American view on what should be done in the Middle East, but Pres. Nixon noted that there still were big areas of disagreement.

Chaplains Pray For Peace

NEW YORK -- A prayer for the early end of hostilities in Vietnam and deepest appreciation to American Jewry for its continued support of the religious and morale needs of Jewish servicemen in Vietnam were keynoted in the Passover message of the four Jewish chaplains in Vietnam.

Conveying their greetings through the Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy of the National Jewish Welfare Board (JWB), the Jewish chaplains

in Vietnam - Chaplains Jack Ostrovsky, Bruce M. Freyer, Harold Wasserman and Mark A. Golub - said: "Here in Vietnam, many thousands of miles from our homes and our families, Jewish servicemen will gather in many areas of the country to participate in Passover Seders (ritual meals) and form families of men brought together by a common heritage. They will relate the story of a struggle by our

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli and foreign observers believe that political considerations were behind the series of massive artillery attacks Egyptian forces have launched against Israeli troops stationed along the entire length of the Suez Canal.

A major factor observers said, was a deliberate attempt by Cairo to create a new war scare in the Middle East and, hopefully, force the major powers and especially the United States to pressure Israel to agree to withdrawal of its forces from Arab territory as the means to avoid another major war.

In addition, pressure from younger military elements within the Egyptian armed forces to "do something" and the need to be as militant as the Arab terrorist organizations have also combined to force Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser to undertake the artillery attacks as a means of quieting these pressures.

Israeli military officers noted that statements from Cairo indicated that Egypt believed that it is inflicting heavy losses on Israeli forces also were a contributing factor. They added that actual Israeli losses were very light.

Observers pointed out that the fierce duels began and continued during a visit to Washington by Foreign Minister Abba Eban. In addition, Egyptian officials were issuing statements in Cairo that a major confrontation could take place "anytime" and that some outside action was needed.

CONG QUESTIONS NIXON PLANS FOR ISRAEL

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- A number of Congressmen have begun inquiries about the Nixon Administration's plans for a \$40 million nuclear desalination plant in Israel proposed by the Johnson Administration. A bill has been introduced in the House of Representatives by Rep. William Fitts Ryan (D.N.Y.) providing assistance to Israel for such a facility but so far, Nixon Administration officials have indicated little support for the project.

Di Lorio and Gaughan said they were "particularly pleased" that Senator Kennedy will take such an active role in the event since it is well known that he is forced to turn down more than 100 speaking invitations each day and is unquestionably the most sought after public figure in America today.

Kennedy is the Democratic Whip of the Senate - the number two leadership position among Senate Democrats.
