PASSOVER MESSAGE

By ARTHUE J. GOLDBERG (Pres. Amer. Jewish Com.)

"As Jews in all parts of the world prepare once more to mark the Passover holiday, which commemorates the oldest recorded struggle for human freedom, we in America are deeply concerned with the threats taht hover over many of our less fortunate coreligionists in other lands.

"In many of the countries in the Middle East, the remnants of once - flourishing Jewish communities have been reduced to fear and despair. Once more, the Jew is being used as hostage and scapegoat, deprived of ireedom, of possessions, of even the right to flee from persecuition. The conscience of mankind must make clear that such behavior can no longer be tolerated, and that, at the very least, the ancient cry of 'Let My People Go' must be recognized.
