"In some of the Communist countries of Eastern Europe, a continuing campaign of anti-Semitism, which erupts from time to time in anti-Semitic materials, in purges and in propaganda, makes the condition of Jews in that part of the world insecure in the extreme.

"In Israel, 2,000,000 of our brethren suffer from the bitter truth that violence solves no problems but simply feeds on itself. Violence continues, as we know from almost daily incidents of terrorism and retaliation, attacks and counter attacks, to inflict its steady toll of death, injury and desolation on soldiers and on innocent citizens as well.

"The crying need of all nations involved in the conflict and of the world community is a just and lasting peace in which every state and all the people in the Middle East can live in security."

GREENSPUN GETS U. OF J. SERVICE AWARD

Hank Greenspun, publisher of the LAS Vegas Sun, has been chosen to receive the Community Service Award of the University of Judaism in Los Angeles. young men who aspire to receive ordination at the Seminary. The University also services the West Coast Jewish communities and through its University Institute of Jewish Studies, pre-

sents noted scholars from the faculties of the various schools and colleges in special seminars.

He said Arab leaders were "including themselves" if they thought outsiders could impose a settlement in the Middle East without face-to-face Arab-Israeli talks.

"The Arab states cannot convey the Middle East into an international protectorate," he declared. "The destiny of the Middle East will be fashioned by its own residents, not by outsiders."

Mr. Fligelman said he saw "no erosion" of American government support and understanding of Israel's position and that his country felt "no sense of intimidation" as a result of U.S. interest in consultations with Britain, France and the U.S.S.R.

"The Middle East is not on the verge of war," he declared. "Only if there is unilateral intervention by one of the great powers will there be the danger of renewed fighting. I do not see any of the world's powers inclined to such a move."
