'SHOW ISRAEL WE CARE'

NEWTON, Mass. (Special)-
Hubert H. Humphrey urged the
United States and especially its
Jewish community to redouble
the effort to show Israel "that
we care."

Referring to the Arab-Israeli
tension as the most dangerous in
the world, Humphrey said, "Is-
rael needs to know that we care
and our government must know
that we care."

The former Vice President,
senator, and unsuccessful
Democratic Presidential candi-
date, flew to his Boston suburb
from Washington to address the
Business Men's Council of the

Combined Jewish Philanthro-
pies. He spoke to some 800
persons.

Humphrey, now a political
science professor at Macalester
College in Minnesota, noted that
while the Arab nations were re-
ceiving arms and support from
the Soviet Union, Israel "sits
there as an independent state
with an arms embargo imposed
by France and 50 United States
jet fighters still undelivered."

held in Berchtesgaden, Germany.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The United Nations General

committee of three states to "investigate Israeli prac-
tices affecting the human rights of the population" in
the occupied territories.

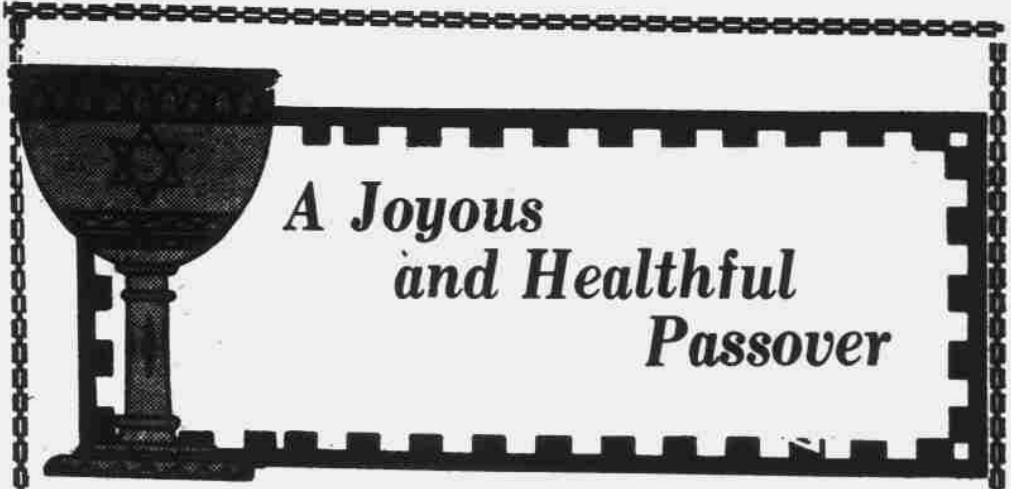
NEW YORK (WNS) -- Seven cartoons of Jewish religious
