Love Letter

There's something stirring about a love letter, don't you agree?
I recently read such a note; it is of an unusual nature. It's not a letter from a swain to his sweetheart, nor even from a parent to a child. A unique billet-doux, it's from a rabbi to those who teach in the religious school.
The letter-writer is Rabbi Emanuel Kramer, of Congregation Ohev Shalom, York, Pa., who wrote his faculty, "I know," writes the rabbi, "That you love your Judaism... I know that you love the children you teach... I know that you love your God."
The epistolary vote of confidence begins, "So often you are the defenseless recipients of carping criticism and abuse from shortsighted parents and ill-mannered children (who, thank heaven, are relatively few), "that I feel impelled to send you this long overdue love letter."
The rabbi conceded that some children "are overindulged in luxuries and under-trained in respect for others." These constitute a trial to the hard-working religious school instructor. In a moving passage Rabbi Kramer is sure that the teachers, despite the hardships of their craft, will "continue to see in each new study session a thrilling challenge, a glorious opportunity to bring light, to build loyalties, to kindle love for our faith" in the hearts of their charges.
Continues the love letter: "In a time when many are groping for a path through the wilderness of hate and insecurity... you see in your calling a way to serve Him best by helping to awaken within young spirits an awareness that they are fashioned in the divine image and so is their brother, and that it is only as they respect that divinity in every human being that they can measure up to their own potentials."
Reverence for education is part of the spiritual baggage of Judaism. They say, for example, that Israel is the only nation in the world whose government officials are almost to a man former teachers. So it is uplifting to note a rabbi has found time to address this paean to those hard-working but often underpraised pillars of Judaism: the teachers in the religious schools. Bravo!
