It is good to know that there are close to 350 of these Jewish Community Centers -- and YMHAs, as they are also known -- functioning so effectively in hundreds of our communities throughout the land."

"I should also like to recognize once again the work of the National Jewish Welfare Board," President Eisenhower added, "for it is this organization which is the national association of Centers and Ys. The National Jewish Welfare Board has for many years given direction and guidance, skilled and heartening aid to these Centers, The Jewish Community Center has infused the ordinary lives of an uncounted number of people -ranging in age from the preschool child to the senior citizen -- with purpose, cheer, creative self - awareness.
