# AN IMPOSED SOLUTION

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Prime Minister Golda Meir has reaffirmed Israel's oft-stated position that she will not accept any Big Four imposed solution to the Mideast conflict.

At the same time Foreign Minister Abba Eban told Dr. Gunnar Jarring, the United Nations Mideast peace envoy, that Israel still views his effort as the authoritative international framework to deal with the problem, despite the Big Four talks. (The United States contends that the Big Power talks are designed to aid Dr. Jarring's efforts and the Washington opposes any imposed Mideast peace effort.)

Mrs. Meir said Washington and Jerusalem agree on two important points: the 1949 armistice lines cannot be Israel's future borders and there will be no withdrawal from the occupied territories until peace is reached.

But Mr. Eban noted vital

differences between the two nations on peace in the Middle East. He said the most "serious deterioration" in the American position was Washington's uses as a basis for discussion with the other powers political positions "which do not meet many of Israel's demands." The main difference between the two countries is that the U.S. "feels the time has already come to discuss Israel's future borders." Mr. Eban said there was no reason for Israel to discuss its borders with Washington because there has been no war between the two nations and they do not have any common border. "Such negotiations should be held with the neighboring Arab states," he declared.

(In Washington, it was reported that the American position was deliberately couched in ambiguous language to allow for flexible interpretations.)

### UN CENSURE NO EFFECT ON ISRAEL'S DEFENSE POLICY

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Security Council censure of Israel for an air attack on Jordan is not expected to change the nation's defensive policy of using airplanes to "seek and destroy" Arab terrorist bases in Jordan and will probably further alienate the Israeli public from the United Nations.

Diplomatic observers in Jerusalem noted that the Government recently publicly confirmed what every-

one had known -- that jet fighter bombers were being used against Arab terrorists in a sophisticated version of the United States Army's "search and destroy" operations in South Vietnam. Under the Israeli method, jets attack suspected ter-

rorist bases as soon as they are identified without waiting for some specific Arab attack on Israel.

Israeli military spokesmen have said the move is designed to keep the terrorists off guard and to force them to move their

bases deeper and deeper into Jordan away from the cease-fire line, thereby making it more difficult for the Arabs to shell Israeli border settlements and to infiltrate across the Jordan River into the new territories.
