

AJC PROGRAMS FOR THE YOUNG

WASHINGTON -- The American Jewish Committee is giving increased attention to programs of Jewish identity which might be particularly attractive to young people.

Bertram H. Gold, Executive Vice President, reported this to its policy-making Board of Governors at the same time that he announced publication of a new 96-page booklet providing "a glimpse into the future of Jewish life and identity in America."

The Board of Governors, of which Phillip E. Hoffman is chairman, is holding a special two-day meeting in Washington, where its members are to be briefed on domestic and international matters with which the agency is concerned by a number of officials of the Nixon administration. Among these topics are peace in the Middle East, the urban crisis, the poverty program, religious discrimination in government contract employment, and others.

At a special luncheon session in the Senate Caucus Room, the group was addressed by the new whips of the two parties: Senators Edward M. Kennedy, Massachusetts Democrat, and Hugh Scott, Pennsylvania Republican. Arthur J. Goldberg, president of the American Jewish Committee, will be luncheon chairman.

The new AJC booklet, titled Not Quite at Home: How An American Community Lives With Itself and Its Neighbors, is being offered as a guidebook for students, parents, teachers, sociologists, rabbis, and community leaders in efforts to strengthen Jewish commitment and identity in America. Mr. Gold added that a conference of Jewish educators and community leaders would be held May 5 at the Committee's National headquarters in New York to plan use of the booklet "in line with our effort to improve programs of Jewish education and to establish a firmer sense of identity among Jews throughout the country." Yehuda Rosenman, director of the Committee's Jewish Communal Affairs Department, will chair the conference.

The new booklet summarizes for the general public the findings of the two-volume Lakeville Studies, a survey of Jewish life in a large midwestern suburb, sponsored by the American Jewish Committee and conducted by three well-known sociologists, Marshall Sklare, Joseph Greenblum and Benjamin R. Ringer. The booklet, eleventh in a series published by the Committee's Institute of Human Relations Press in memory of A.M. Sonnabend, its twelfth President who died in 1964, sells for one dollar a copy at 165 E. 56 st., N.Y.C. N. Y. 10022.
