UNITED NATIONS (WNS)--United Nations Secretary General U Thant has accused Egyptian forces of directing artillery fire at UN observation posts on the east bank of the Suez Canal and he warned that cease-fire observers may be pulled out if the firing continued.

Thant told both Egypt and Israel in a secret letter that "I do not feel that this operation can, or should, be maintained indefinitely under such conditions resulting from repeated Israeli aggression."

But UN observers have reported almost two dozen incidents in which Egyptian forces have used artillery, machine guns and mortars in attacks on UN personnel and installations since Mr. Thant sent his letter. The

Secretary General listed UN losses during the almost daily exchanges of fire along the waterway as 48 vehicles damaged, nine trailers, two radio antennas and eight house - trailers destroyed and 27 hits recorded against observation posts.

"Almost two dozen incidents were reported by UN personnel in which Egyptian forces direct fire at them, most of the time "without any Israeli forces in the vicinity." Three attacks by Israeli forces were noted but the UN posts were less than three yards from Egyptian forces.

Diplomatic observers at the UN expressed doubts over the UN's readiness to remove its observers from the canal area. They said (Continued on Page 2)

SO LONG CHARLIE - "GOOD RIDDANCE"

JERUSALEM (WNS)-- Israeli leaders have expressed the hope that the next President of France will help restore harmonious relations between the two nations while also paying tribute to ex - President Charles de Gaulle as one of the most energetic and gallant fighters against Nazism.

The Government's quiet reserve about President de Gaulle's resignation was contrasted by the man-in-the-street who was enthusiastic over the political change in France. While Israelis expressed the opinion that the next French leaders

would be more friendly to Israel, newspapers and Government officials said that any change would come about over a long period and there would be no overnight shift in French policy.

(At the United Nations, the French representative to the Big Four Mideast talks, told the other Powers and

Arab delegates that there would be no immediate change in French Mideast policy. French representatives in Arab nations have been working to dispell fears that there would be a major reversal in Paris' pro-Arab policies.)

(Arab leaders and news media have called Presi-

dent de Gaulle's resignation a set-back to the Arab cause and there was widespread fear that the new French Government would lift the embargo on arms shipments to Israel and undertake other pro-Israel moves, western newsmen have reported from Arab capitals.)

U.S. PLANES FOR JORDAN

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The Nixon Administration has agreed to a new \$30 million arms deal with Jordan calling for the sale of a second squadron of 18 F-104 jet interceptors, armored personnel carriers, communications equipment and small arms. A request for more tanks was turned down.

The Nixon Administration reportedly views the agreement, reached with Jordan during King Hussein's recent visit to Washington, as primarily a symbolic gesture to bolster the King's standing among Arabs and to satisfy the demands of his officers' corps for more new weapons. Israel, it was said, had no cause for concern because jet deliveries have not begun and Jordan's capabilities are still far inferior to Israel's. Jordanian and Israeli pilots are training at United States Air Force bases.

The Johnson Administra-

tion had concluded an arms deal with Jordan just before the Six-Day War but delivery of F-104s purchased then have been delayed and are not expected to start until some time this summer. It had been thought that an option for the second squadron would not be approved because the original shipment had not been completed and Jordan did not have airport facilities or pilots and crew personnel for more aircraft.
