UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -United Nations Secretary General U Thant has accused Egyptian forces of directing artillery fire at UN observation posts on the east bank of the Suez Canal and he warned that cease-fire observers may be pulled out if the firing continued.

Thant told both Egypt and Israel in a secret letter that "I do not feel that this operation can, or should, bemaintained indefinitely under such conditions resulting from repeated Israe-II aggression."

But UN observers have reported almost two dozen forces. incidents in which Egyptian machine guns and mortars in attacks on UN personnel und installations since Mr. Thant sent his letter. The
